His heart's in Conestogo

STOUFFVILLE — Edwin R. Good is a proud father—grandfather—great-grandfather.

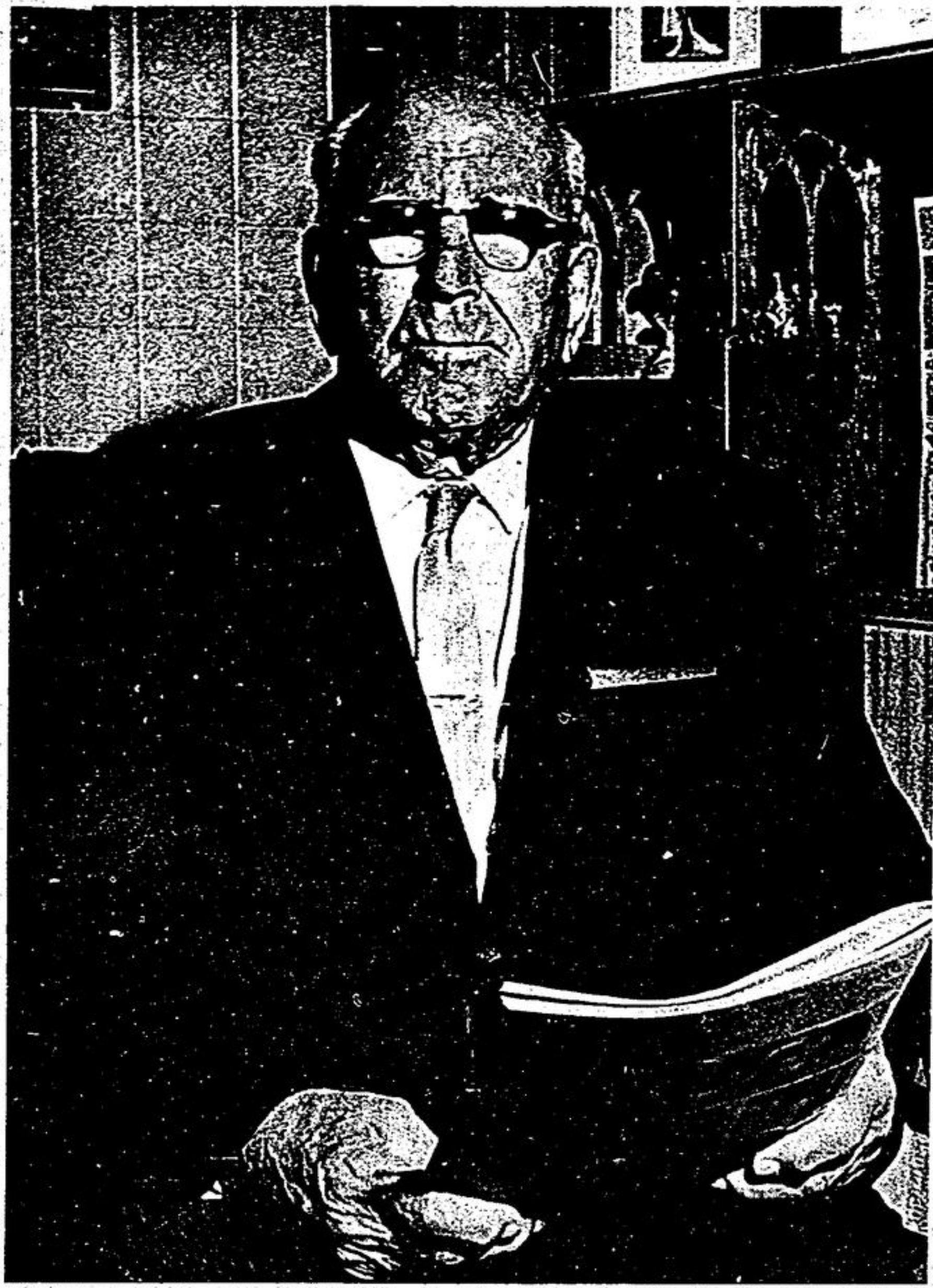
The signs are everywhere throughout his small but immaculate upstairs apartment at 3 Baker Avenue. Photographs of his family, some in color, some black and white, are placed where they can be seen - by him and by others.

On Friday, Aug. 21, Mr. Good will celebrate his 85th birthday. And on Sunday, the occasion will be marked with a family dinner and reunion at the home of a daughter, Helen, in Floradale, north of Elmira. The others will all be there, Edward of Waterloo, Harold, Montreal, Garth, Stouffville, Evelyn (Mrs. Charles Mackechnie) Toronto; Ruby, also of Toronto; Audrey (Mrs. Rev.) Robt. Clyde) Kincardine; Lois (Mrs. Cecil Titus) Markham and the hostess, Helen (Mrs. Gordon Hall). There are 17 grandchildren and 4 great-grandchildren.

Mr. Good, a handsome gentleman, is a native of Conestogo, near Waterloo, the son of Henry and Sarah Good and one of a family of twelve. His father was the village blacksmith.

In 1932, he and his wife, a registered nurse, came to Stouffville and opened up the Brierbush Hospital, Main Street East. Within a period of 12 years, the accommodation was increased from 4 beds to 25 and a staff of five.

Mr. Good's work as the village assessor is well known, beginning in 1946 at a salary of \$150 a year. He later took over the same

position in Markham Village, remaining there 11 years. He holds an honorary life membership in the York County Assessment Association.

An active man all his life, Mr. Good enjoys being busy, whether his pastime is painting, doing jig-saw puzzles or quietly reading another chapter from the family Bible. He is a member of the Stouffville Missionary Church and a regular attendee at services every Sunday.

But in spite of his long association with Stouffville, its business and its people, Mr. Good's heart belongs back in his boyhood community of Conestogo.

"It holds many wonderful memories," he

admits, "I try and get there once a year. The old home has changed very little".

A few of those pleasant

AREA MUNICIPALITY of the TOWN OF MARKHAM PREPARATION AND REVISION of VOTERS' LIST

Notice is hereby given that a list of eligible voters has been prepared to be used for the election of members of Council for the Area Municipality of the Town of Markham and School Trustees for York County Roman Catholic Separate School Board.

WARDS

The Area Municipality of the Town of Markham is divided into six wards defined as follows:

WARD 1

That area bounded by Yonge Street on the west; the line between lots 30 and 31 on the north; the proposed King's Highway number 404 on the east and Steeles Avenue of the south; the said area comprising lots 26, 27, 28, 29 and 30 in Concession 1, lots 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 in concession 2 and those parts of lots 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 in concession 3 which lie west of the proposed King's Highway number 404.

WARD 2

That area bounded by Yonge Street on the west; the King's Highway number 7 on the North; the proposed King's Highway number 404 on the east and the line between lots 31 and 30 on the south; the said area comprising lots 31, 32, 33, 34 and 35 in concession 1, lots 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10 in concession 2 and those parts of lots 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10 in concession 3 which lie West of the proposed King's Highway number 404.

WARD 3

That area bounded by the proposed King's Highway number 404 on the west; 16th Avenue on the north; the 7th line of the west and Steeles Avenue on the south; the said area comprising those parts of lots 1 to 15 inclusive in Concession 3 which lie east of the proposed King's Highway number 404 and lots 1 to 15 inclusive in concessions 4, 5 and 6.

WARD 4

That area bounded by the 7th Line on the west; 16th Avenue on the north; the King's Highway number 48 on the East and Steeles Avenue on the South; the said area comprising lot 1 to 15 inclusive in concession 7 together with that part of the Town of Markham which lies West of the King's Highway number 48.

WARD 5

That area bounded by King's Highway number 48 on the west; 16th Avenue on the north; the town line between the Township of Pickering and the Township of Markham on the east and Steeles Avenue on the south; the said area comprising Lots 1 to 15 inclusive in concession 8 together with that part of the Town of Markham which lies east of the King's Highway number 48; and Lots 1 to 15 inclusive in concessions 9 and 10 and lots 1 to 15 inclusive in Concession 11.

WARD 6

That area bounded by the proposed King's Highway number 404 on the west; the line between lots 31 and 32 on the north; the town line between the Township of Pickering and the Township of Markham on the east and 16th Avenue on the south; the said area comprising those parts of lots 16 to 31 inclusive in concession 3 which lie east of the proposed King's Highway number 404 together with lots 16 to 31 inclusive in concessions 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 10.

QUALIFICATION OF VOTERS

All persons who are British subjects, of the full age of 21 years and not disqualified under THE MUNICIPAL ACT or otherwise by law prohibited from voting and are resident in a local municipality or part thereof for the period between the 1st day of January, 1970, and the 5th day of October, 1970, are entitled to be entered on the voters' list, in addition to those ordinarily so entitled.

REVISION OF VOTERS' LIST

Application may be made by any person who complains that any name has been omitted from the list or that the names of persons who are not entitled to be voters have been entered on the list, to the Returning Officer in his office and the office of the Clerk of the Town of Markham on any day except Sunday or a legal holiday during the period from the 11TH DAY OF AUGUST to the 29TH DAY OF AUGUST inclusive on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. and also on the 14th day of August and the 21st day of August between the hours of 7:30 p.m. and 9 p.m.
