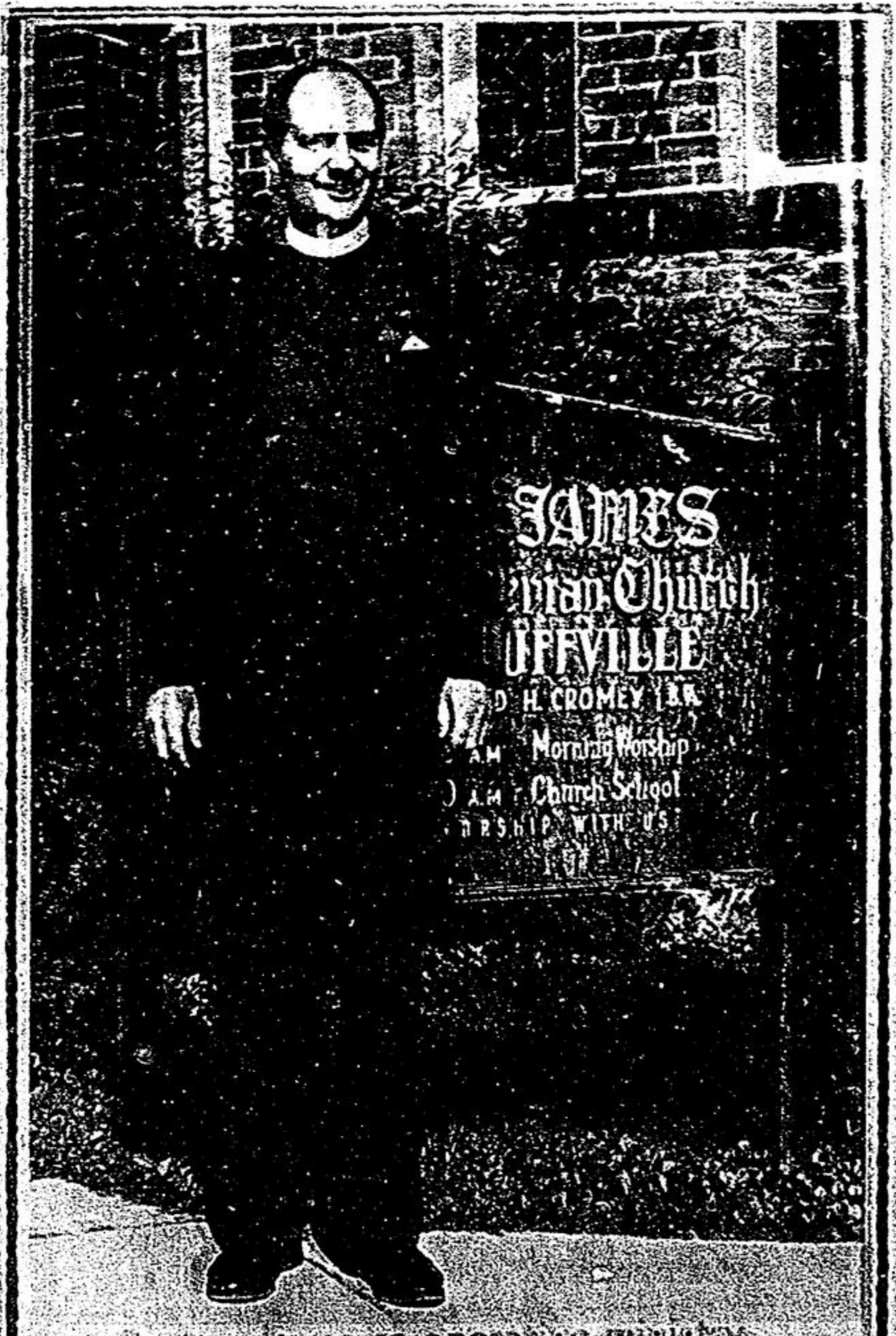
Master science teacher at Summitview school
