

STOUFFVILLE - The Stouffville Peewees opened another door to the Ontario Championship by taking East Gwillimbury 7-4 at Mount Albert. This was their second victory in the best-of-three series. They now advance to the semi-finals with Sterling, a town 15 miles north of Trenton.

Once again, the Don Anderson Haulage boys made the most of the least with 7 runs on a meagre 4 hits. Five walks also helped. After an 8-4 loss in the initial game, East Gwillimbury bounced back with a first inning explosion which saw them hit a single, a homer, a single and then another homer. That gave them four runs and a fairly commanding lead. In the fourth inning. Stouffville tied it up and then added a three-run buffer in the fifth.
