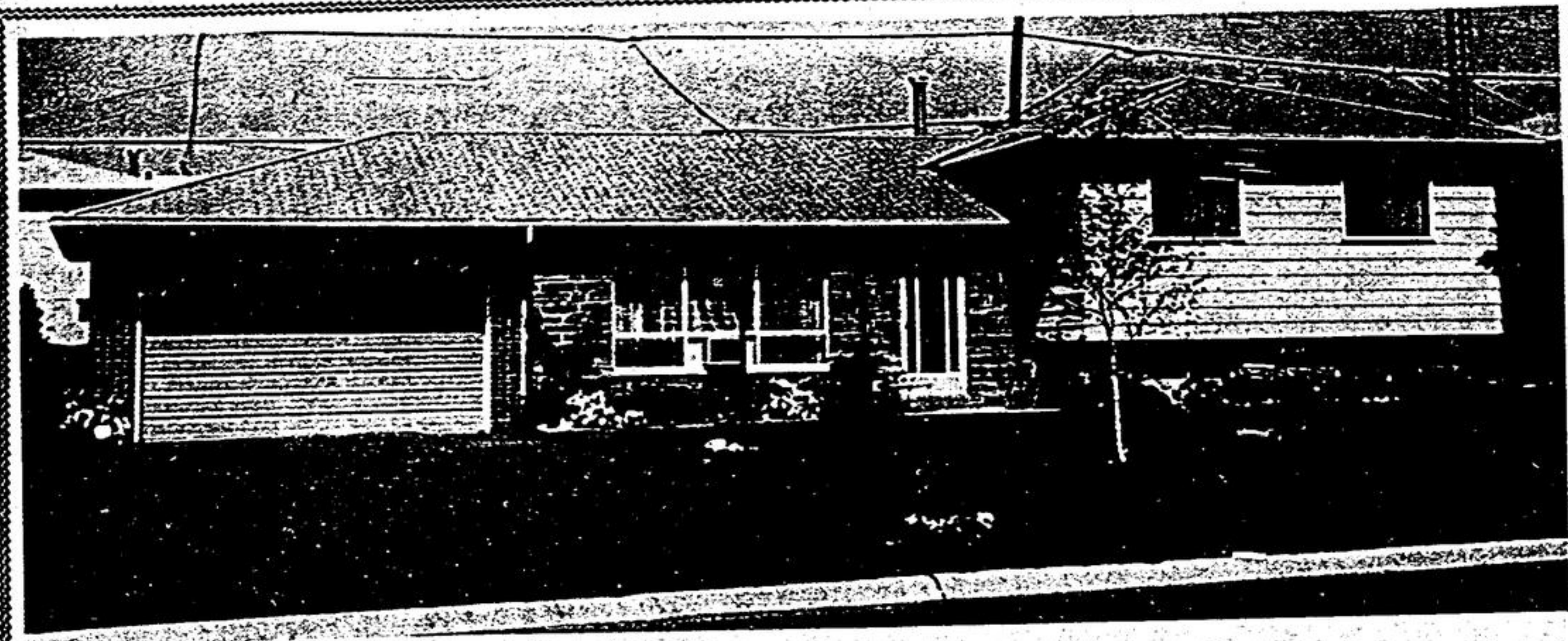


Fined \$100

Enrollment climbs

STOUFFVILLE — Student enrollment at Stouffville Dist. Secondary School has reached 1,051, an increase of 76 over the same period in 1969.

A breakdown shows 317 students in the elementary program - 157 in Grade seven; 146 in Grade eight and 14 in Special Education classes.

The secondary program has 734 including 193 in Grade nine; 191 in Grade ten; 153 in Grade eleven; 134 in Grade twelve and 63 in Grade thirteen.

The staff includes 55 teachers.

ORANGE CUP CAKES
1 1/2 cups once-sifted pastry flour
2 1/2 tsp. baking powder
1/2 tsp. salt
few grains of mace (optional)
10 tbsp. butter or margarine
1 cup granulated sugar
2 eggs well beaten
2 tsp. grated orange rind
1/2 cup orange juice
1/4 tsp. vanilla
Grease cup cake pans. Preheat oven to 350°.
Sift flour, baking powder, salt and mace together. (3 times). Cream butter or margarine, gradually blend in sugar. Add well-beaten eggs, part at a time, beating well after each addition; mix in orange rind.
Combine orange juice and vanilla. Add flour mixture to creamed mixture, about a quarter at a time, alternating with 3 additions of orange juice, and combining lightly after each addition.
Two-thirds fill prepared cup cake pans with batter. Bake in preheated oven 25-30 minutes.

APPLESAUCE LOAF
1 1/2 cups sifted all-purpose flour
1 1/2 tsp. cinnamon
1 tsp. allspice
1 tsp. nutmeg
1/4 tsp. ground cloves
1/2 tsp. salt
1 tsp. baking soda
1/2 cup shortening
1 cup sugar
1 egg, well beaten
1 cup unsweetened applesauce
Set oven for moderate 350°. Grease loaf pan 9 x 5 x 3 inches.
Sift together flour and next six ingredients. Set aside. Cream shortening in a mixing bowl. Slowly add and beat in sugar; beat until well blended. Add and beat in egg. Add and stir in applesauce. Add sifted dry ingredients, stirring only enough to blend. Turn cake batter into pan. Bake 50 to 60 minutes. Cool cake slightly in pan on wire rack. Remove from pan; cool on rack. Frost with butter frosting.

BUTTER FROSTING
Blend 2 cups sifted confectioners' sugar with 1/2 cup butter or margarine. Gradually add about 2 tsp. cream. Stir until smooth. Add 1/2 tsp. vanilla, 1/2 tsp. orange extract and a few drops each yellow and red food coloring. Stir to blend.
