The Good Fellowship Class is holding a bazaar and bake sale in the United Church basement, Sept. 25

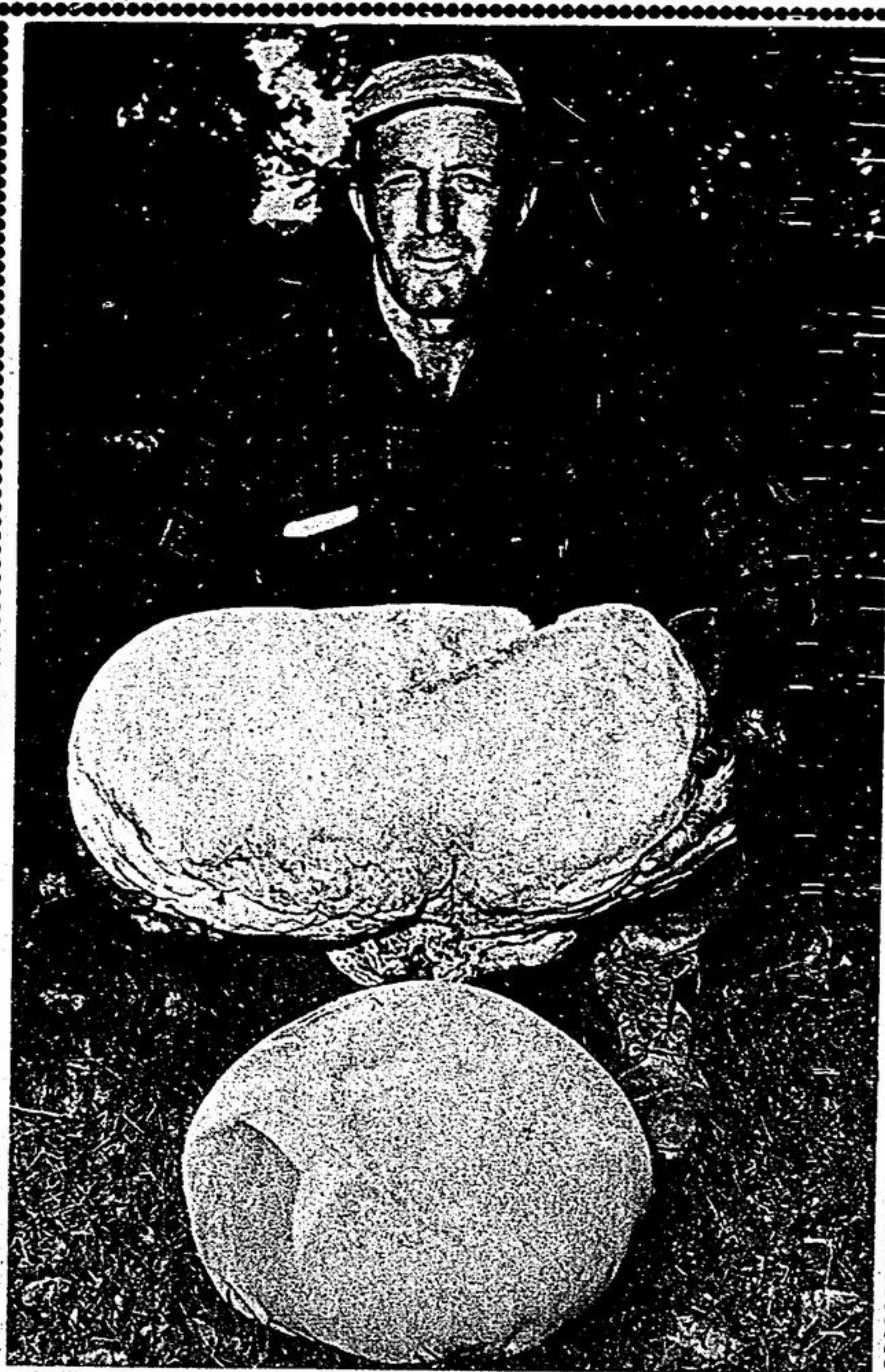

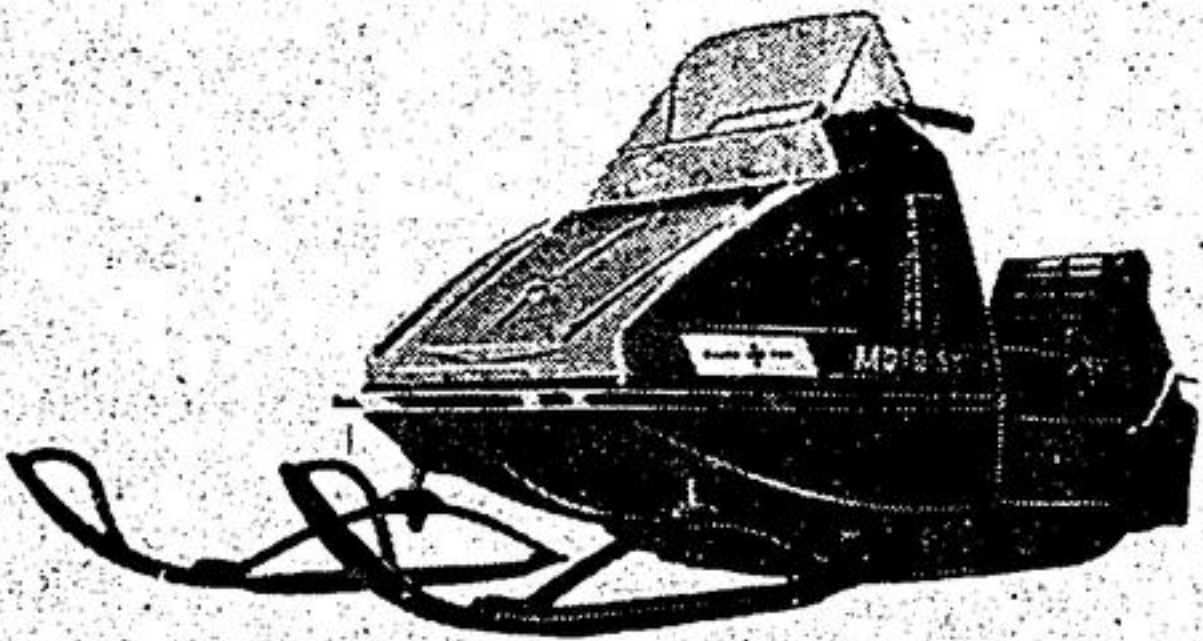
