Unionville couple wed 60 years

UNIONVILLE - What symbol could better represent 60 years of married life than the diamond? It has two major qualities - durability and lustre. And so has the marriage of Dr. and Mrs. Kennedy, who celebrated their diamond anniversary on Sunday. Their Unionville home was open to a flock of friends who dropped by to honor the popular couple.

Shovel marks in the garden and the hand mower leaning against the garage were evidence of the 82 year old doctor's health. His wife, 'Gertie', just 3 years younger, displays the same vitality accompanied by a very keen memory.

In reminiscing about his earlier days, the posture-perfect doctor explained, "I recall the first automobile to come to Aurora. It was great on the level stretches, but sure needed help on the hills". Later, in 1919, he purchased his own auto, "a second-hand Ford with no reverse and gas lamps which were constantly extinguished when going over bumps". The only chiropractor around, he registered 30,000 rough miles annually.

During the coldest months, the Kennedys make haste to St. Petersburg, Florida to soak up the sun, "shuffle and bowl".

Native of Germany

UXBRIDGE TWP. - In 1952, George Striebich and his wife, the former Mary Falk, came to Canada from Germany.

The couple, just married, were to start a new life in a new land.

On Sept. 9, 1970, Mr. Striebich died, the victim of cancer and seven months illness.

In the 18 years between his coming here and his passing, the deceased was able to establish an electrical contracting business at Goodwood, R.R. 1 and, even more important, a wide circle of friends.

Mr. Striebich was only 47.

A highly skilled man in his profession, he was always willing to go out at any hour of the day or night to render his services.

He was identified with Sacred Heart Church, Uxbridge.

Surviving is one sister, Erika, a recent visitor at their Goodwood district home and two brothers, Walter and Erich, all in Germany.

Prayer service was conducted Sept. 11 in the O'Neill Funeral Home, Stouffville and later, the funeral service in Sacred Heart Church, Uxbridge, Saturday morning with Pastor Adrian Lee, SCJ in charge.

Cremation followed in Toronto with his ashes to be returned to Germany for burial in the Black Forest where both he and his wife were born.
