## Plan senior public school

STOUFFVILLE - The arrangement, whereby Grades 7 and 8 are accommodated within the extended program of the Stouffville Dist. Secondary School, is only temporary, Arthur Starr, vice-chairman of York County Board of Education told a nomination audience, Monday. When development warrants further expansion, a senior public school will be built to take care of these students, Mr.

Starr explained. He is seeking re-election for another two-year term. He is being opposed by John McMurray, Elm Road, Stouffville. Mr. Starr said some serious thought was needed to ease the education tax load from properties. He said, too, that any thought of relocating the north Metro boundary at proposed Hwy. 407, would be to the detriment of residents both

north and south of this line.

Mr. McMurray said that to his knowledge, he is the only educator seeking a seat on the County Board.

He said that while he was anxious to provide students with the best education possible, he was also conscious of the cost involved. "Don't look for a colossal monument for a school building," he said, "but something practical and functional for all".

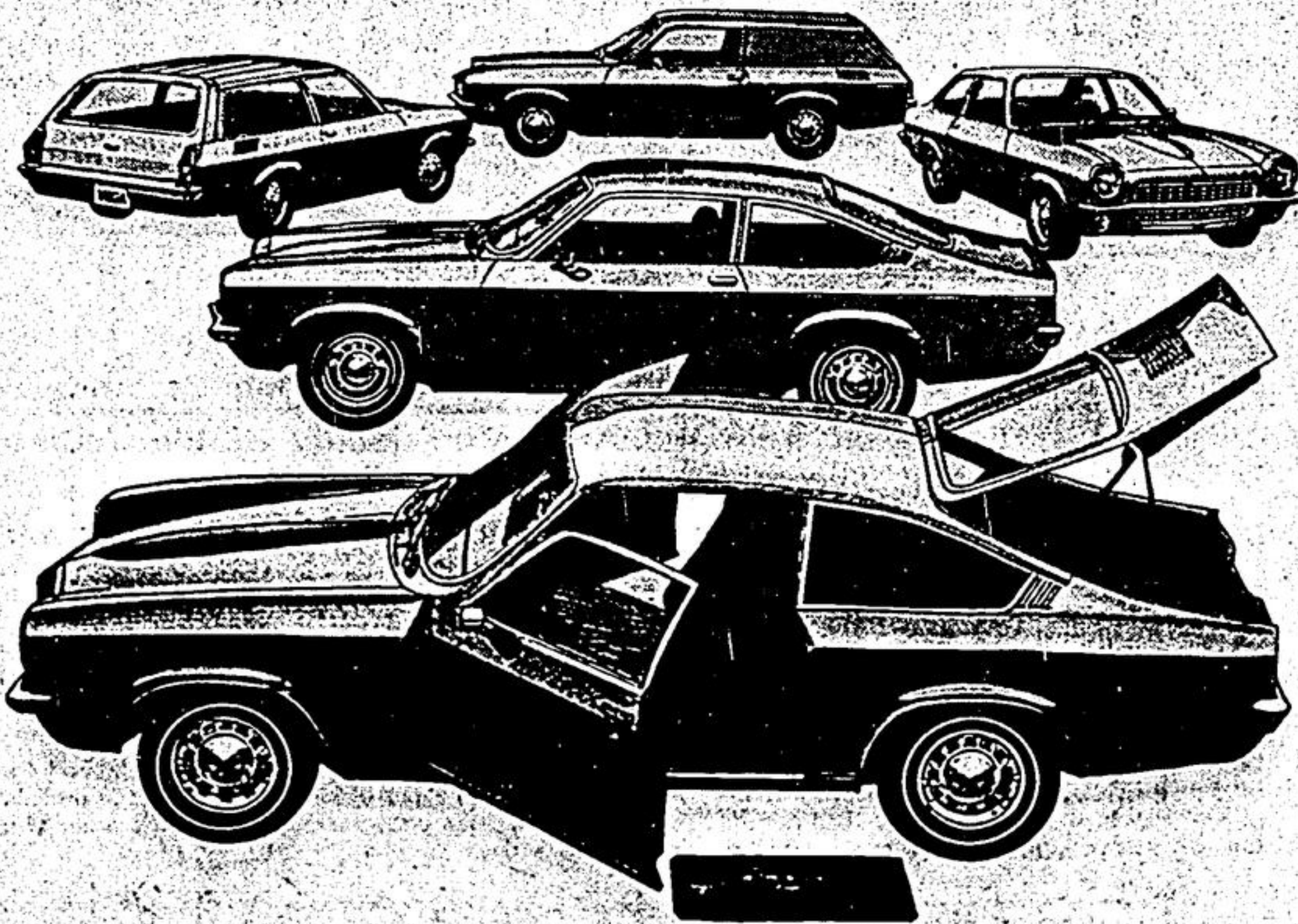
**Three cars and a truck.**
