The Patterson family, including Mr. and Mrs. Murray Brown and family, spent Thanksgiving weekend at their cottage near Bancroft.

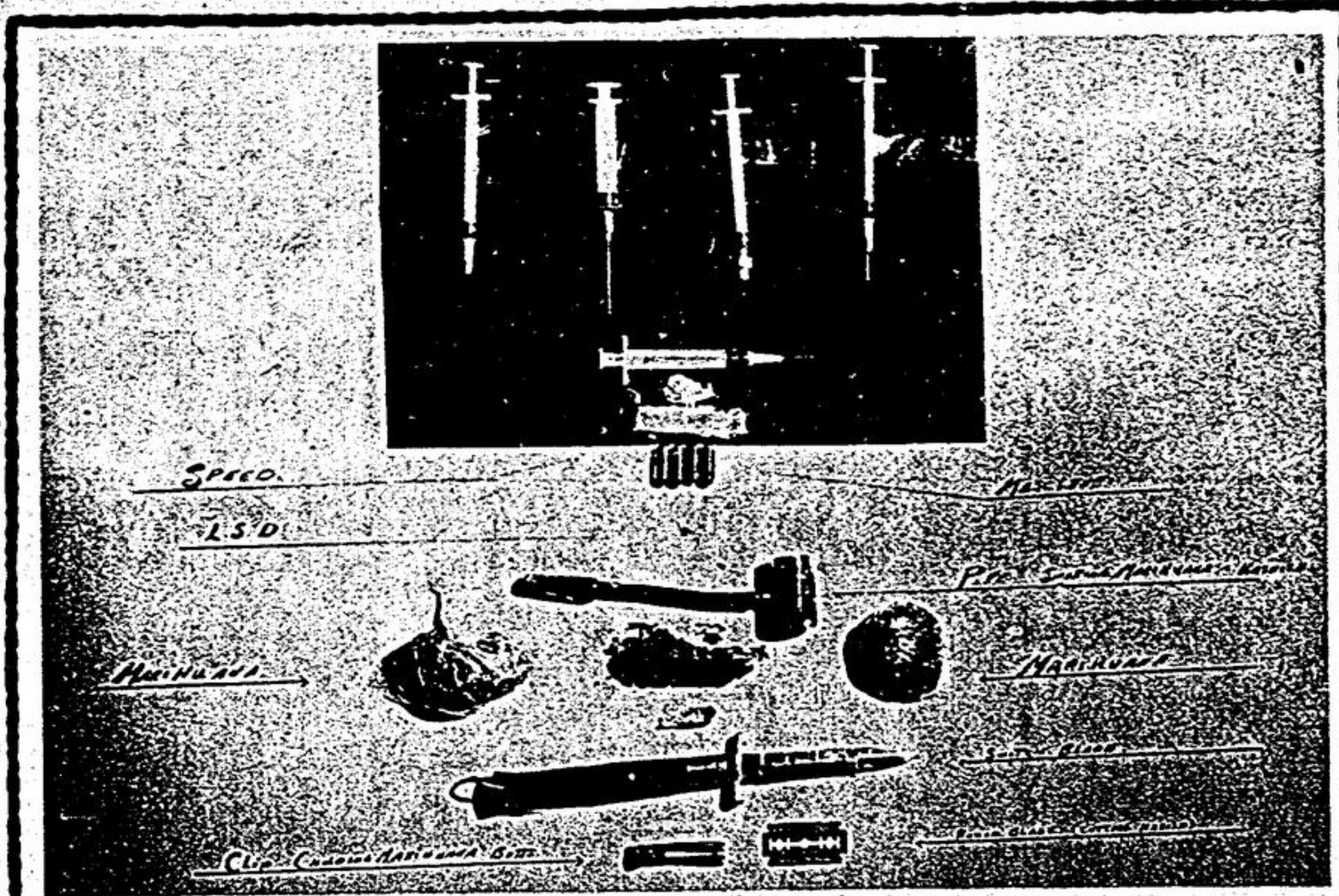
A welcome home is accorded Mr. and Mrs. W.J. Dean following a summer at their ranch.

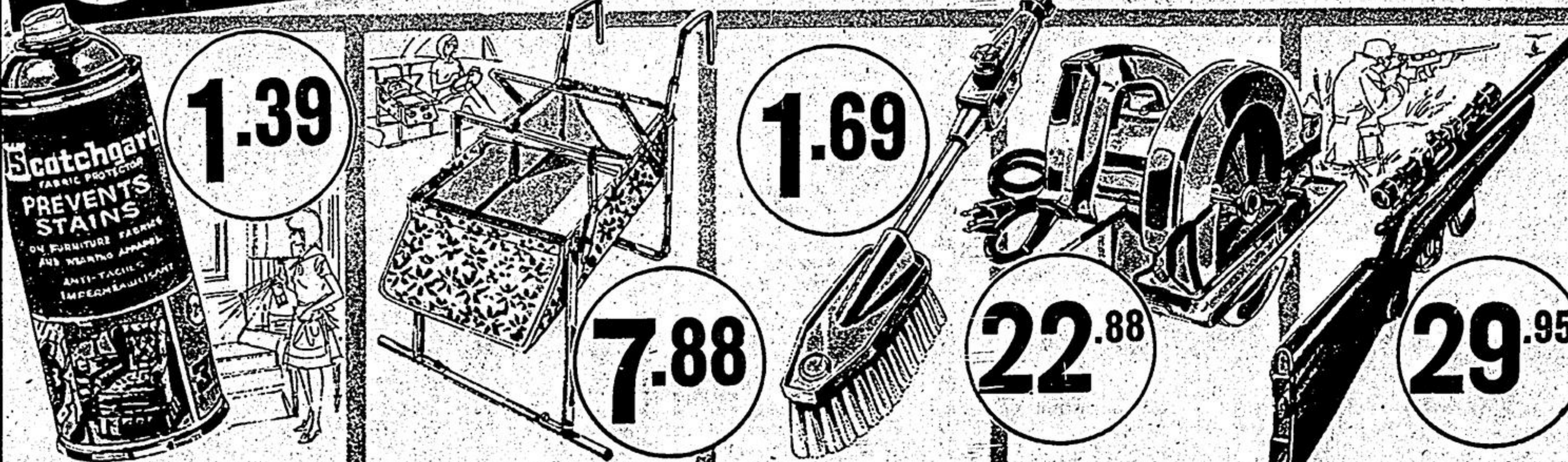
