Markham youth charged

MARKHAM — A 16 year old Markham youth was fined a total of \$100 after he pleaded guilty to two charges of drug possession heard in Richmond Hill Court, Oct. 16.

Ian McArthur, a student in grade 11 at Markham High School, was questioned by police while he was in the company of two other youths behind a hut on school property during an evening dance, Sept. 11. Evidence revealed.

The youths were sent home, the police said, and from Vandorf and Lemonsville attended a weekend 'Scottish Tattoo' at Willow Springs Camp. Gordon May, Fifth Line, cooked the porridge and haggis. Each lassie made a Glengarry (hat) of Highland-tartan and a white sporran to hang from her belt. These were worn at the gathering of the clans Saturday evening and at the Highland Games, Sunday.
