

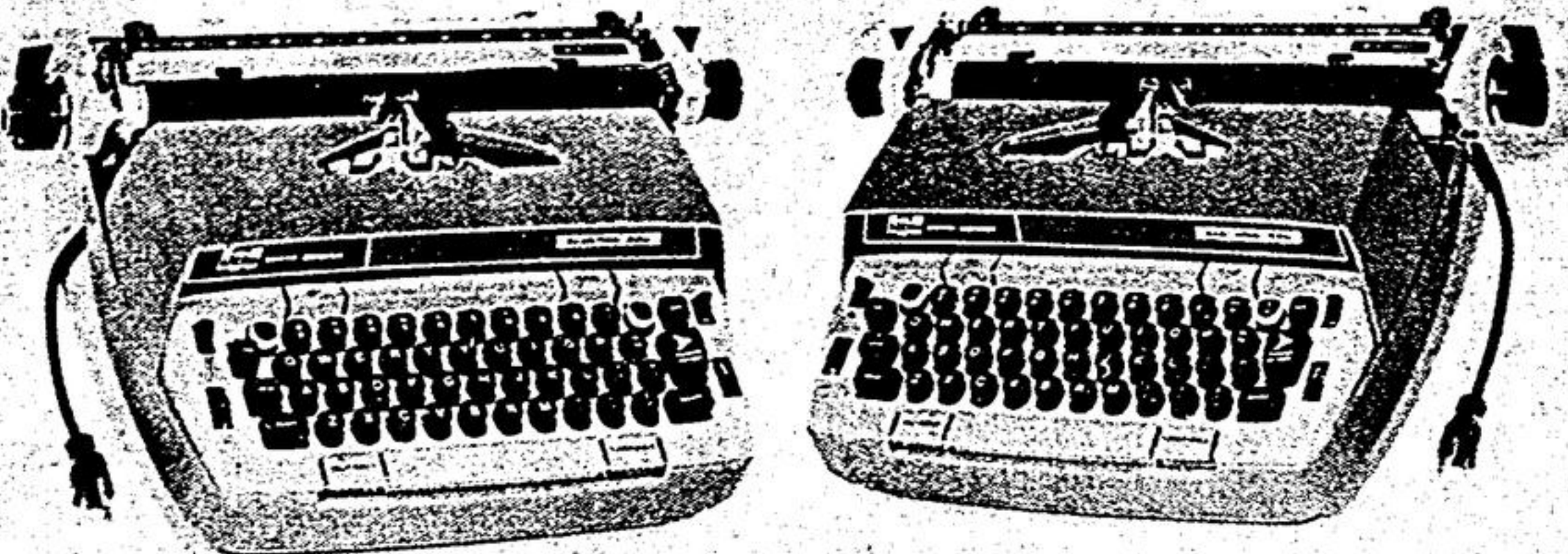
Anniversary services

RINGWOOD - Anniversary services at Ringwood Christian

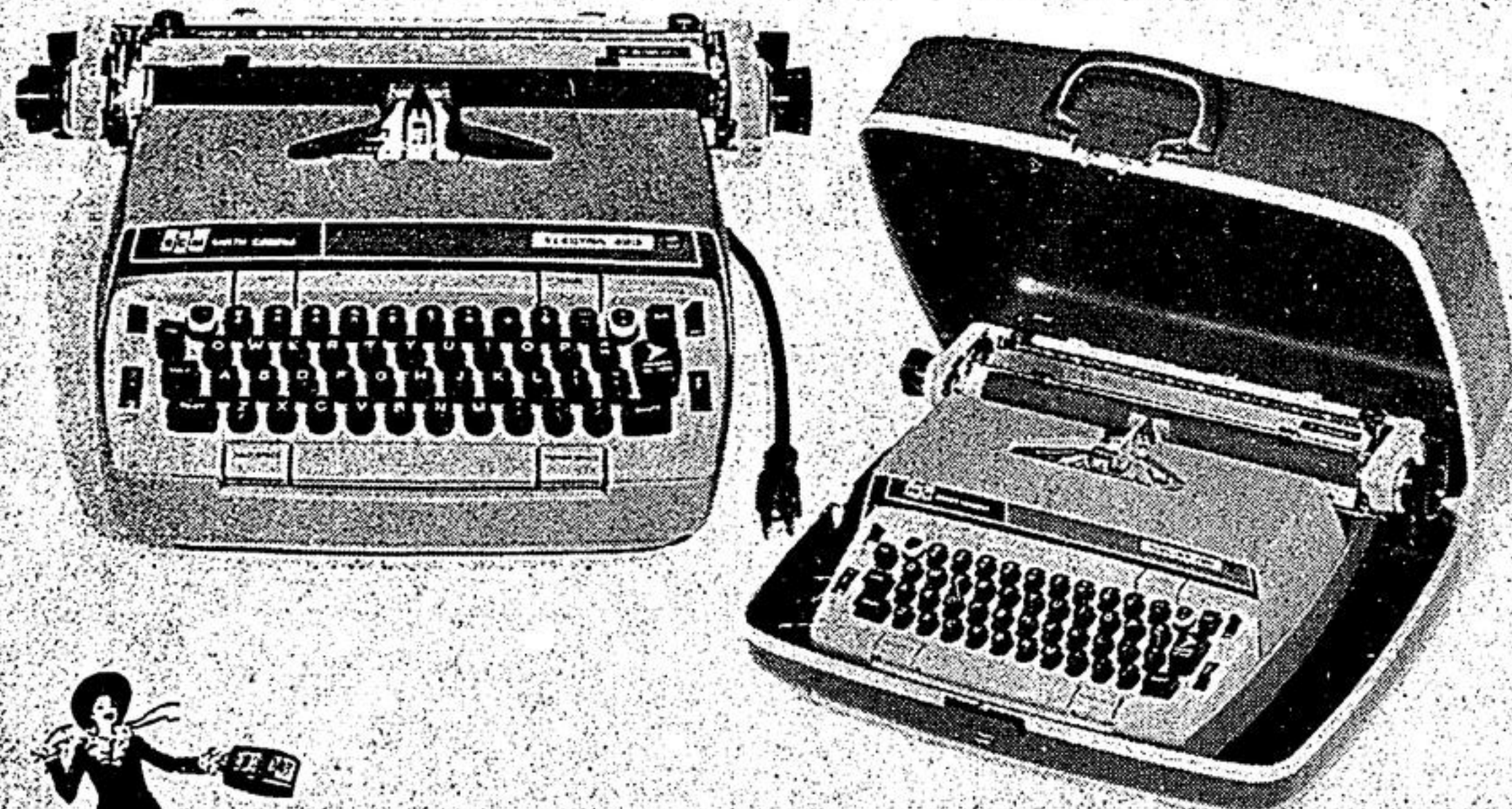

WHITCHURCH TWP. - Four Stouffville and Uxbridge area men have been charged in connection with the alleged theft of five snowmobiles, valued in excess of \$4,000.

Constable Douglas Murray, Whitchurch Twp. Police, broke the case, when he stopped a truck on the 9th concession north of Stouffville at 3 a.m.

Arrested were - John Hall, 23 and Edward Hall, 22 of R.R. 3, Uxbridge; Phillip Prentice, 21, R.R. 4, Stouffville and Robert Herbert, 22, Stouffville, R.R. 2.

The machines, the property of Kinch and Sutton, Hwy. 7, Markham had been reported missing earlier by Markham Town Police.

Officers Fred McNeil and Wm. Thomas, Markham Chief, Fred White praised the work of the men, in particular officer Murray who made the initial arrest.
