Forced cruiser off road

MARKHAM TWP. - A Willowdale man who forced a Markham Township Police Cruiser off the road was fined \$100 when he appeared at Richmond Hill Court, Dec. 22. David Jubb entered a plea of not guilty to a charge of dangerous driving, but, after hearing evidence for the prosecution, the court allowed the charge to be reduced to careless driving, to which the accused entered a guilty plea. P.C. John Morrison testified that he was eastbound on Highway 7 near Bayview Avenue when he went over the crest of a hill to find the accused man's car approaching in the wrong lane. P.C. Morrison pulled onto the shoulder and then made a U-turn, following the vehicle to Bayview where he made an out of control turn, narrowly missing a stopped car.

Service station operator fined

STOUFFVILLE - A Stouffville service station operator was fined \$50 following conviction on a charge of employing a person as a mechanic without a certificate. Michael S. Hunt represented in Richmond Hill Court by counsel Gord Ness. A plea of guilty was entered. Evidence revealed that a Department of Labor inspector attended the west end garage Oct. 20 and saw one of Mr. Hunt's employees replacing brake shoes. A mechanic's certificate or enrollment in an apprenticeship program in the garage is needed to perform this task by law, the inspector told the court.

Markham area youth elects trial by judge and jury

MARKHAM - A Markham area youth, apprehended by police on two drug charges, elected trial before a judge and jury when he appeared in Richmond Hill Court, Dec. 18. John Bartlett was charged, Oct. 8, with possession of hashish for the purpose of trafficking, and, Oct. 23, with possession of L.S.D. for the purpose of trafficking. He was committed for trial on the first count on consent when the crown attorney agreed to reduce the charge to ordinary possession. On the second count, a 15 year old Markham area juvenile told the court, under the protection of the Canada Evidence Act, that he had obtained a quantity of the drug from the accused, Oct. 23, intending to pay for them later. They were hidden under a tree near Box Grove and turned over to police following questioning. In a written statement by the accused introduced into evidence, it was stated that he admitted the sale of the drugs, 40 tablets in all, for which he asked \$40. The drugs, he said, had been purchased at Rochdale College in Toronto. He said further that he was remorseful, considering the act 'stupid'. Judge Charles told the man that anyone driving in this condition should be kept off the road as he endangered the lives of everyone. An order prohibiting driving for 12 months was issued.

Potential killer - judge warns; levies \$250 fine

GORMLEY - A man termed a 'potential killer' by Provincial Court Judge M.A. Charles was fined \$250 on a charge of impaired driving heard Dec. 22 in Richmond Hill Court. John Maguire entered a plea of guilty to having over 80 milligrams of alcohol in his blood while driving an automobile. Acting on information received, Markham Township Police intercepted the accused man southbound on Don Mills Road at Gormley. He was driving from side to side on the highway, forcing northbound cars to pull onto the shoulder. Evidence revealed the man was uncoordinated and could not remove his drivers licence from his wallet when asked. At the police station, he could not perform physical tests. A breathalyzer gave readings of 2.2 and 2.3. Judge Charles told the man that anyone driving in this condition should be kept off the road as he endangered the lives of everyone. An order prohibiting driving for 12 months was issued.
