MARKHAM — St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church in Markham, looked on by Herb and Catherine (Cassie) Thomas as a kind of 'second home', became that in reality, Dec. 27, when the well-known and highly respected couple celebrated their Golden Wedding Anniversary.

More than 200 family relatives and friends many from a distance, attended the gathering, held both afternoon and evening.

Mr. and Mrs. Thomas mixed freely among their guests, radiating a warmth that dispelled all concern for the weather outside.

Herb Thomas was born on the 7th concession of Markham, the son of William and Mary Thomas. While still young, his parents moved to Scarborough where he attended public schools at Ellesmere, No. 8 and No. 10. In 1914, they moved back to Markham, this time to conc. 9 near 16th Avenue.

Mrs. Thomas, the former Catherine Johnston, was born at Beaverton, the daughter of Lachlan and Marion Johnston. She attended Eden Public School and later Markham High School, when her parents moved to the village in 1908. Following graduation from the College of Education, she accepted a teaching position on the staff of Franklin School where she was held in high regard by her pupils and their parents.

Herb Thomas and Cassie Johnston were married, Dec. 27, 1922, at her home on Albert Street, Markham. Rev. Walter Auld performed the ceremony. Later, they travelled by train to Buffalo, returning to the Ninth Line farm following the honeymoon.

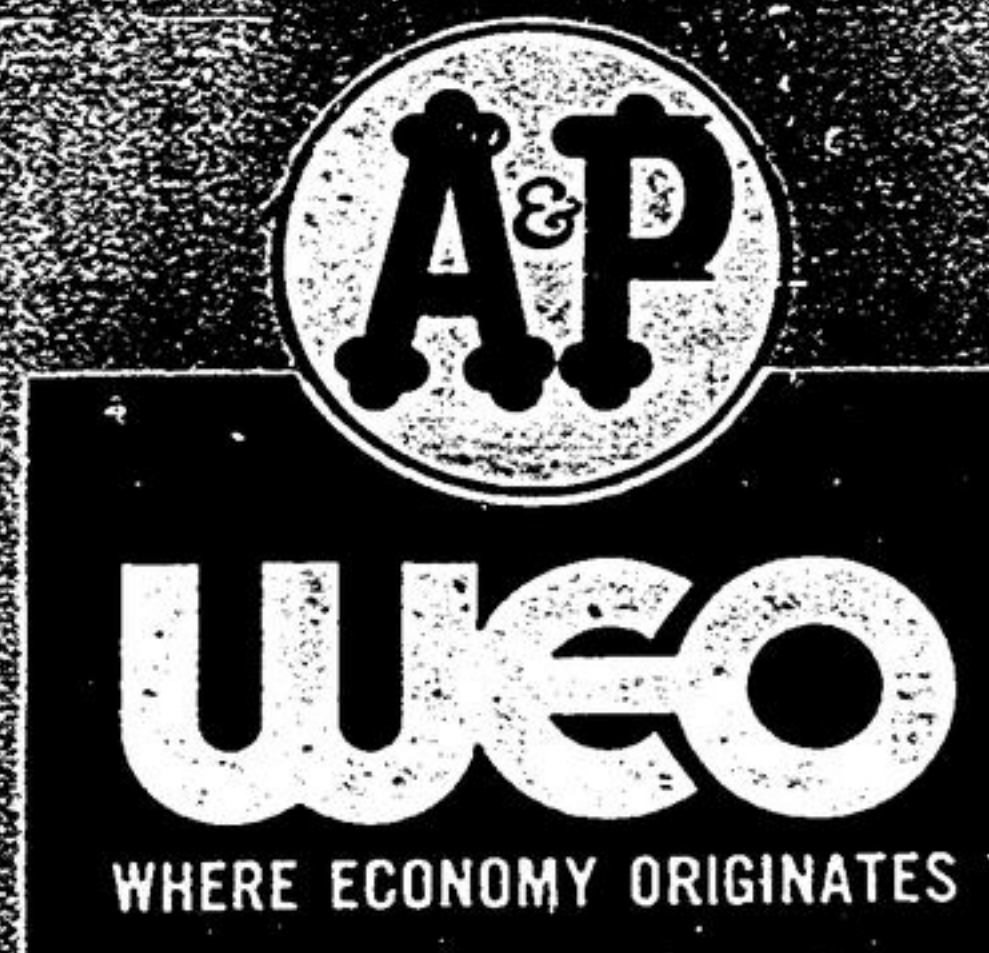
