Fourteen wins in a row

STOUFFVILLE — Daryl Wright's third period goal, gave the Becker's Milk Midgets their fourteenth consecutive win in league action this season. Only two scheduled games remain, both with West Rouge. The next is a home encounter tonight, "Thursday," at 9.15. The team has put

together a tremendous season, winning fifteen league games with their only loss being to Port Perry.

Wright scored from Randy McNelly, who is having some kind of super season, and Mike Wightman at 1:35 of the third. McNelly, on a patented solo rush, put away the insurance goal at 4.35. The Uxbridge fires went out when they failed to beat Jack Holder on a couple of good tries and Kevin Barrick cashed away a Bob Houser pass at 8:50, to seal the win.
