

# Drugs "a phase" for the majority - physician

# "New library needed"

STOUFFVILLE — Don't "freak out"; "play it cool" is the advice of Dr. John Dennison who has made an extensive study of the drug scene over the past few years. Dr. Dennison was not offering words of wisdom to drug users, but to parents concerned that their children may be tempted to "experi-

ment". He was advising them not to get agitated at the first sign of a marijuana joint in their offsprings' pockets. Marijuana, the doctor contends, is non-addictive and far less dangerous than the commonest of drugs, alcohol and tobacco; "medically it is less harmful". Dr. Dennison, a re-

sident of Mt. Albert, with a medical practice in Newmarket, has worked closely with drug users in York Region. He presented his views at a meeting of Whitechurch - Highlands School Parents' Association, Feb. 7. The speaker reminded adults in the audience that the temptation to

use drugs didn't have to be tested by them as youngsters. But he made the analogy, "Some of us tried booze when we were told not to." "In all honesty," he continued, "for the majority of kids who experiment with drugs, it seems to be a phase... Fifty per cent of the students in high school

(they can't all be everybody else's kids, some of them have got to be ours) are experimenting with alcohol, marijuana or hashish and most of them will stop right there." The doctor concluded that it is the very small minority that go on to chemical drugs who should evoke concern; "the kid who has

problems handling the drugs he is using has got problems handling life." Although urging parents not to get "up tight", if they discover their son or daughter smoking marijuana, "till you know how much, how often and when", he did not advocate legalizing the drug. "If you legalize it, yo-

ung people could get into other mischief that might not be so safe." was his comment on it remaining "forbidden fruit". Dr. Dennison concluded that most people come to the decision on their own that drug-taking is dull and unproductive; that there are better things to do in life.

STOUFFVILLE — "Library service now, and hopes for the future" was the basis of a presentation, made by Stouffville Librarian, Mrs. Doris Lapp, to the Tuesday Morning Young Wives Group, Jan. 30, at the Anglican Church. Mrs. Lapp outlined what can be expected of the present facility. "As

of now, we are able to offer a film service, on a limited basis," she reported, explaining that films from the Central Ontario Regional Library could be booked, at a month's notice, by groups. However, projector and screen would not be available with the film, because the local library did not have one at their disposal.

Mrs. Lapp indicated that there were a large variety of books with large, clear print on the shelves, specifically for elderly people and that the Board were attempting to build up its collection of material on local history. "If you want to get a popular book, reserve it. You can reserve any book in the library," Mrs. Lapp reminded her audience, adding that the staff can always be reached by phone, even when the library is closed. Short reference questions could be answered over the phone.

Mrs. Lapp appealed to the 21 "Young Wives" present to lend their support to the programs and concluded with a special request to generate public interest in a new building and expanded services. It suggested a campaign for funds could be precipitated through a Library Development Committee.

## Less than 20 percent landowners reject Port

There were some revealing figures in the recent report announced by the Minister of Transport Jean Marchand concerning the new Pickering airport. It was revealed that only 136 of the 815 people whose land will be expropriated for the site objected at the recent hearing. An additional 130 land owners within the airport zone expressed a desire to have the development take place. Thirty percent of the objectors were found to be outside the affected zone.

## NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR APPROVAL TO EXPROPRIATE LAND

IN THE MATTER of an application by the Minister of Transportation and Communications for approval to expropriate lands in the Town of Whitechurch-Stouffville, in the Regional Municipality of York, in the Province of Ontario, for the purpose of acquiring sufficient land for the widening and reconstruction of the King's Highway 48.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that application has been made for approval to expropriate the land described in the schedule hereto.

Any owner of lands in respect of which notice is given who desires an inquiry into whether the taking of such land is fair, sound and reasonably necessary in the achievement of the objectives of the expropriating authority shall so notify the approving authority in writing.

- (a) in the case of a registered owner, service personally or by registered mail, within thirty days after he is served with the notice, or, when it is served by publication, within thirty days after first publication of the notice;
- (b) in the case of an owner who is not a registered owner, within thirty days after the first publication of the notice.

### NOTES:

- The Expropriations Act, provides that:
  - (a) where an inquiry is requested, it shall be conducted by an inquiry officer appointed by the Minister of Justice and Attorney General;
  - (b) the inquiry officer,
    - (i) shall give every party to the inquiry an opportunity to present evidence and argument and to examine and cross-examine witnesses, either personally or by his counsel or agent, and
    - (ii) may recommend to the approving authority that a party to the inquiry be paid a fixed amount for his costs of the inquiry not to exceed \$200 and the approving authority may, in its discretion, order the expropriating authority to pay such costs forthwith.
- "owner" and "registered owner" are defined in the Act as follows:
  - "owner" includes a mortgagee, tenant, execution creditor, a person entitled to a limited estate or interest in land, a committee of the estate of a mentally incompetent person or of a person incapable of managing his affairs, and a guardian executor, administrator or trustee in whom land is vested;
  - "registered owner" means an owner of land whose interest in the land is defined and whose name is specified in an instrument in the proper registry, land titles or sheriff's office, and includes a person shown as a tenant of land on the last revised assessment roll;
