## Library is urgently needed

The Tribune must be commended for its concern about the disappearance of the children's section of the Whitchurch-Stouffville Public Library. It is unfortunate that the public does not realize what is actually at stake in this issue.

If parents believe that "the schools" are carrying on, (or taking over) where the Public Library left off, they are seriously handicapping both the school and the child. Educational authorities agree that the quality of a child's reading depends in no small measure upon his experiences with books at an early age. Six years of age is too late to begin the process of internalizing the values of literature and the joy of reading.

Too often we meet children and adults who have become functional readers, yet remain illiterate. Where literacy is not a major goal of the community, and of the home it will continue to be an unachievable goal in schools. "As long as communities continue to give library facilities a low priority in their budgets we will continue to see books such as 'The Happy Hooker' making the best seller list.

To suggest that a child's library should be part of the school has some merit. However, school collections are quite specialized and designed to serve curricular needs. To produce libraries which could also serve the needs of the pre-schoolers and young adults would require massive injections of money and an increase in the physical plants of schools in this community. Problems of control, access and priority would be difficult to solve.

Children, especially pre-schoolers, would benefit most by seeing that their parents use the public library, by accompanying them to that library and learning to value the services it provides. To separate the children's library from the adult library, as suggested in the Tribune, would create an artificial distinction, reinforcing the attitude that "Reading" is an activity carried on only in schools.

The Tribune has pointed the way to remedy this situation. Citizens must express their indignation and focus attention on the cramped, overtaxed building. We must point out that our children are being seriously deprived and require that Council take action.
