The residents of Whitchurch-Stouffville should question the rationale behind this hunt in as much as only the barest of evidence seems to have been presented to justify it. Granting the possibility of an over-population of deer in the area, and acknowledging that 'management' of this population is a scientifically arguable remedy, I ask why the Department of Natural Resources and its trained personnel do not undertake the task directly. What is the rationale behind licensing the general populace at ten dollars a head to participate in this kill?

The citizens of this region need to be alarmed when members of the local conservation group make such ambiguous statements as the one reported from one member: "Should any problems occur, the hunt would be discontinued for 1974."

All residents of the area who oppose this hunt should make their opposition known and visible.
