

The Mayor reports

From the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville



Each week, Gordon Ratcliff, Mayor of Whitchurch-Stouffville, discusses issues of current interest to ratepayers in the municipality. Residents wishing replies to particular problems, may contact the Mayor personally, or write 'The Mayor', c/o The Tribune, Main St., Stouffville.

Question: Is our water supply system adequate to handle anticipated residential development in town over the next few years?

Answer: To ensure proper water pressure, in case of power failure, municipal and regional engineers feel that we should add a diesel-generator at our reservoirs for pumping from wells-to-reservoirs-to town. Council agrees this should be installed at an estimated cost of \$65,000. We have also decided, on their recommendation, to develop a new well to provide reserve capacity. A 12" water main will be laid from the railroad tracks at Sunset Blvd., east across the former Booth property, north up Stouffer to Montreal Street. This will be close to an elevated water storage tank which will be erected in the next stage of residential development. The \$110,000 cost of laying the main will be shared by the developers whose plans are already being processed for the east end area.

Question: Do you intend continuing repairs to sidewalks in town this year?

Answer: Yes, \$6,000 has been set aside for the sidewalk program, which is comparable with the amount spent last year. A 242' extension of the sidewalk is planned on the south of Main Street, from the 9th line. The east and west sides of Albert will receive \$1,000 worth of repair work and Albert (north) \$354. The south side of Main East will also receive attention as well as 10th Line south.

Question: Will you enforce regulations against properties overgrown with weeds this summer?

Answer: Yes, this season changes in the Noxious Weed Act will allow Council to decide which weeds should be controlled in the municipality. Residents will be given notice to cut these weeds followed by a warning by our inspector, James Rae, if it's not done. Failing action on the part of the landowner, the municipality will move in, cut the weeds and charge it against taxes. I think the failure of the past Noxious Weed Act was that it did not cover weeds that cause distress through allergies. Hopefully, we will be able to regulate these to some extent in this area.
