And as for food, well there's pancakes, home baking, a beef barbecue, hot dogs, pies, hamburgers, ice cream, an ox roast and beer garden.

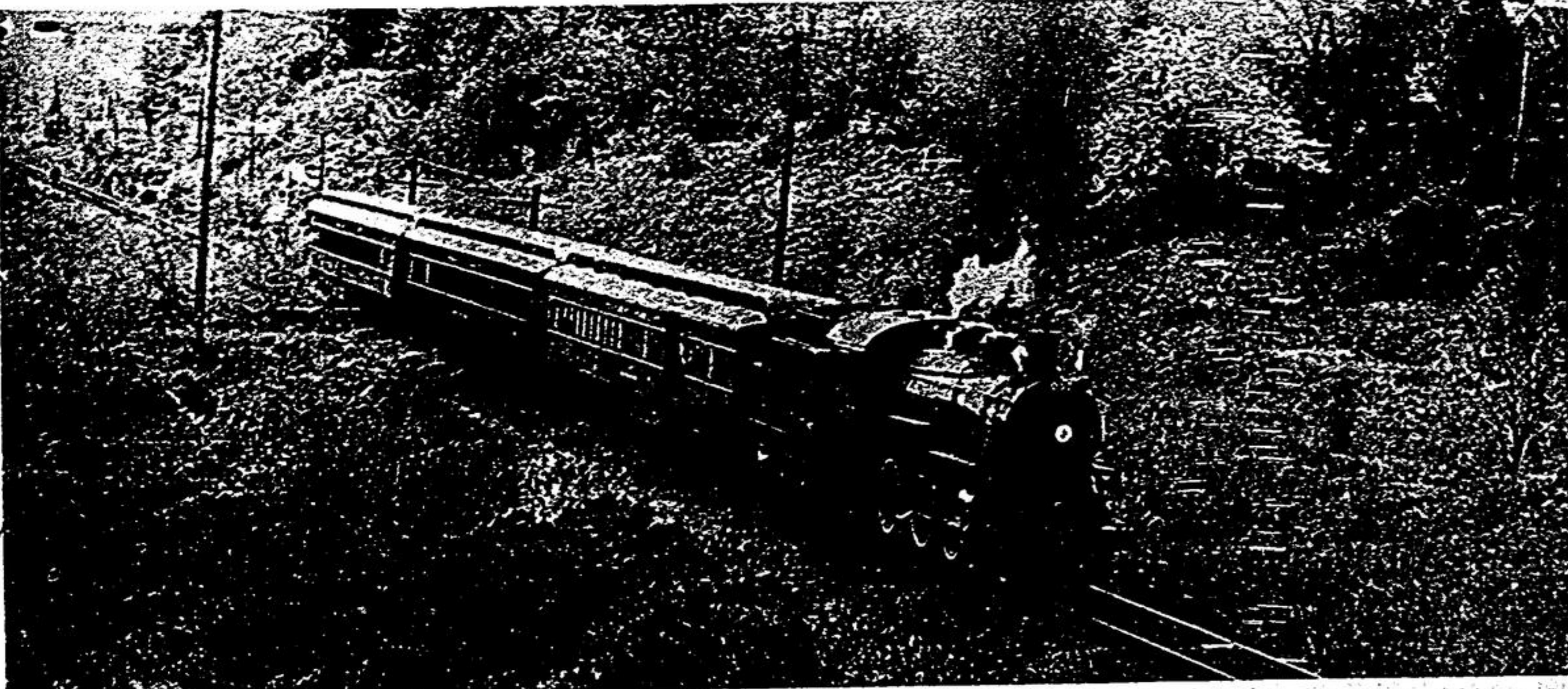
So dig out your centennial dud of '67 or come as you are. The day is yours, to do as you please—Saturday, that is, Unionville Festival Day.

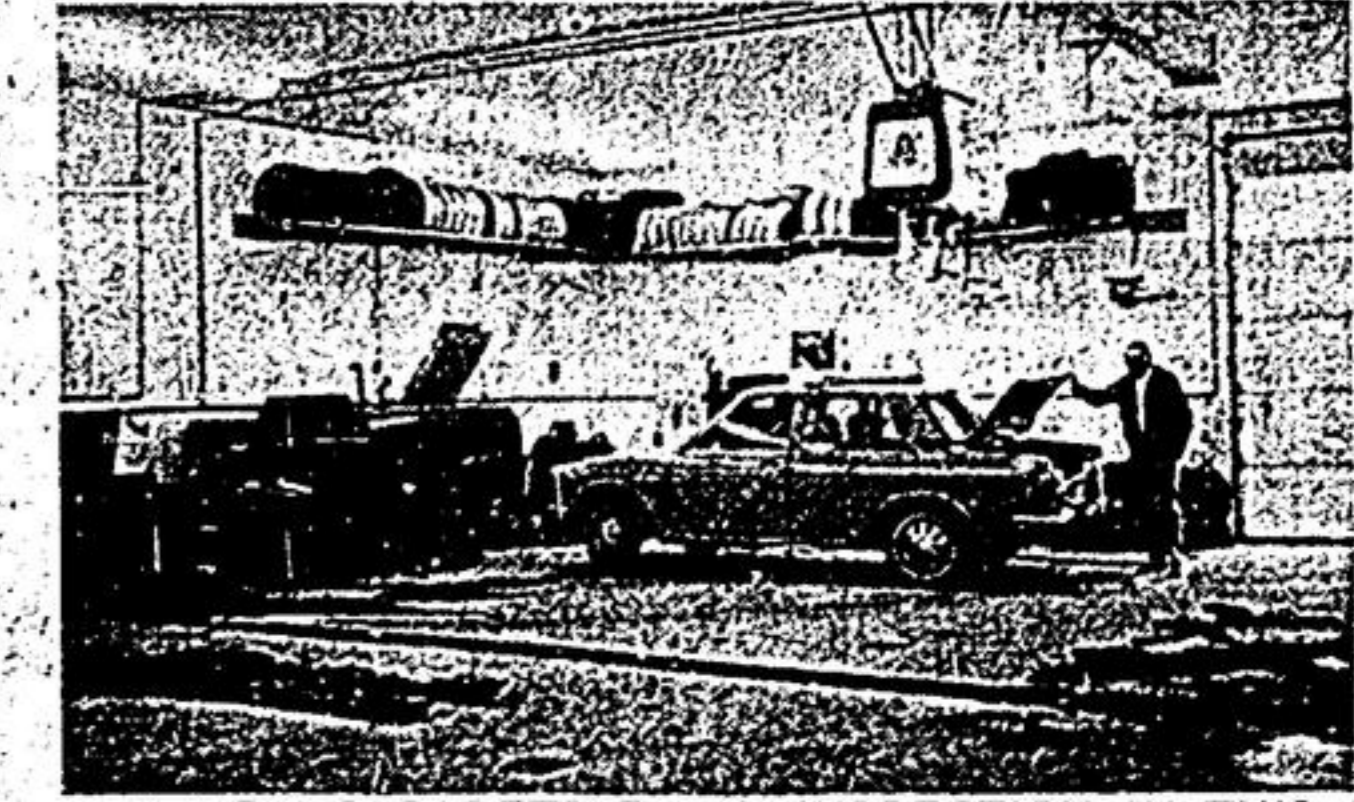
