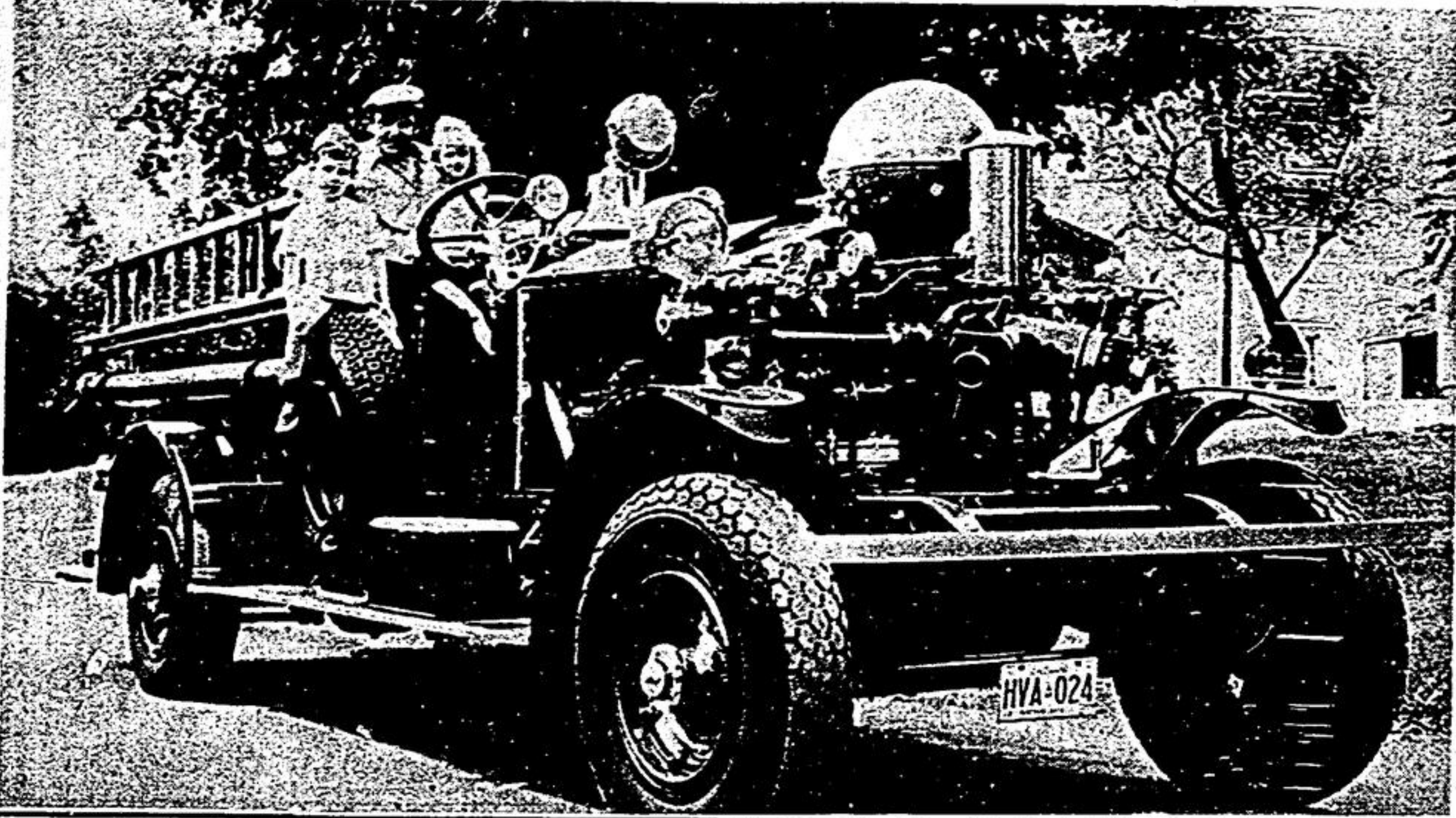


# Markham to host Ontario firemen

## Hydro issue Planner favors Town proposal

STOUFFVILLE — The Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville has been assured the support of Regional Planning Commissioner Murray Pound, when the controversial Hydro tower line issue comes before Regional Council, Thursday (to-day).

Mr. Pound will argue in favor of a route, extending south from Newmarket along the west side of Hwy. 404 to the Parkway Belt, and east to Pickering.

"I will not support another corridor until it is proven to me the Parkway Belt can't be used," he told a meeting of Town Planning Committee, July 19.

The region's chief planner said that while the Province had established the location of the east-west Belt, they didn't own it. "It would appear that the first Utility to use, will have to buy it, and that's the problem, the cost," he said.

Mr. Pound suggested the choosing of the route, could develop into a "hot discussion".

Whitchurch-Stouffville is opposed to the line running east of Hwy. 404 as it would slice through a section of the hamlet of Vandorf. They also reject an east-west route parallel to the Bloomington Road.

Councillor Art Starr hinted that interested residents would be welcome to sit in on the discussion at Newmarket, Thursday afternoon.

From Aug. 3 through 6, the Town of Markham will host the Ontario Firefighter's Association field day and parade, with an estimated 1,000 delegates in attendance. The procession, Aug. 6, will include firetrucks old and new, like the antique on display recently at Cedar Beach, Musselman's Lake, owned by Metro Toronto. —Sheila McLeod.
