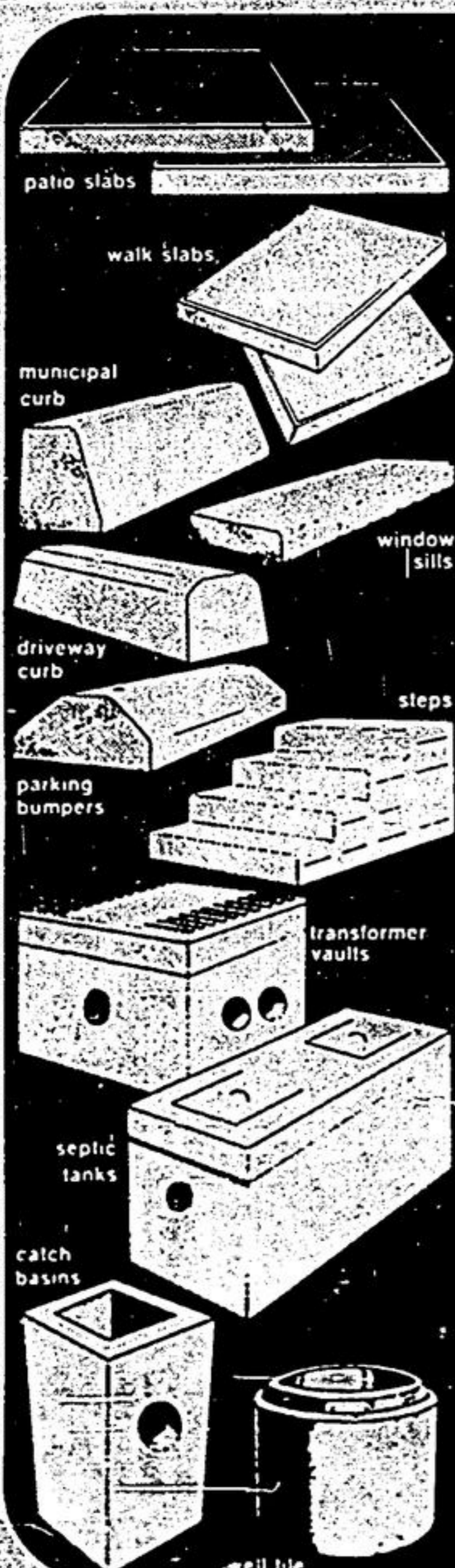

research project leading to a Master of Science degree in Zoology. The nature of the project is a study of the effects of ecological determinants on the breeding and nesting habits of the Grebe, a tailless bird. This summer he is employed at the Delta, Manitoba, Waterfowl Research Station at the southern end of Lake Manitoba.

In previous summers he has worked at the Ontario Veterinary College as a research technician on wildlife diseases, and at the Waterfowl Research Foundation as a research assistant. Before entering university, Mr. Ferguson received a Brock District High School grade 13 gold medal in biology.

Now in its ninth year, the Gulf Canada Fellowship-Scholarship program will benefit a total of nine graduate and 28 undergraduate students at a cost of \$100,000 during the 1973-74 academic year. Winners of seven \$1,000 undergraduate scholarships for sons and daughters of company employees will be announced in August.
