

Recently I noticed in The Tribune, a third of a page advertising the New Construction Safety Act. This legislation makes safety regulations the lawful duty of everyone from the contractor down to the workman. Any violation can bring a fine of \$10,000, and 12 months in jail. This sounds like one of the most severe laws on safety passed for some while. How utterly incredible to admit we have to force people to protect themselves. I have watched pedestrians dash across several lanes of traffic, amidst screeching brakes and a chorus of horns, to catch a bus.

Does it seem possible that our courts should have to protect children from wilful neglect by parents? It seems unthinkable that parents or any adult could beat a baby to death. Yet, this has happened too frequently. However, let us think of a more terrible neglect — a more dreadful danger. This is moral bankruptcy and spiritual barrenness.


