

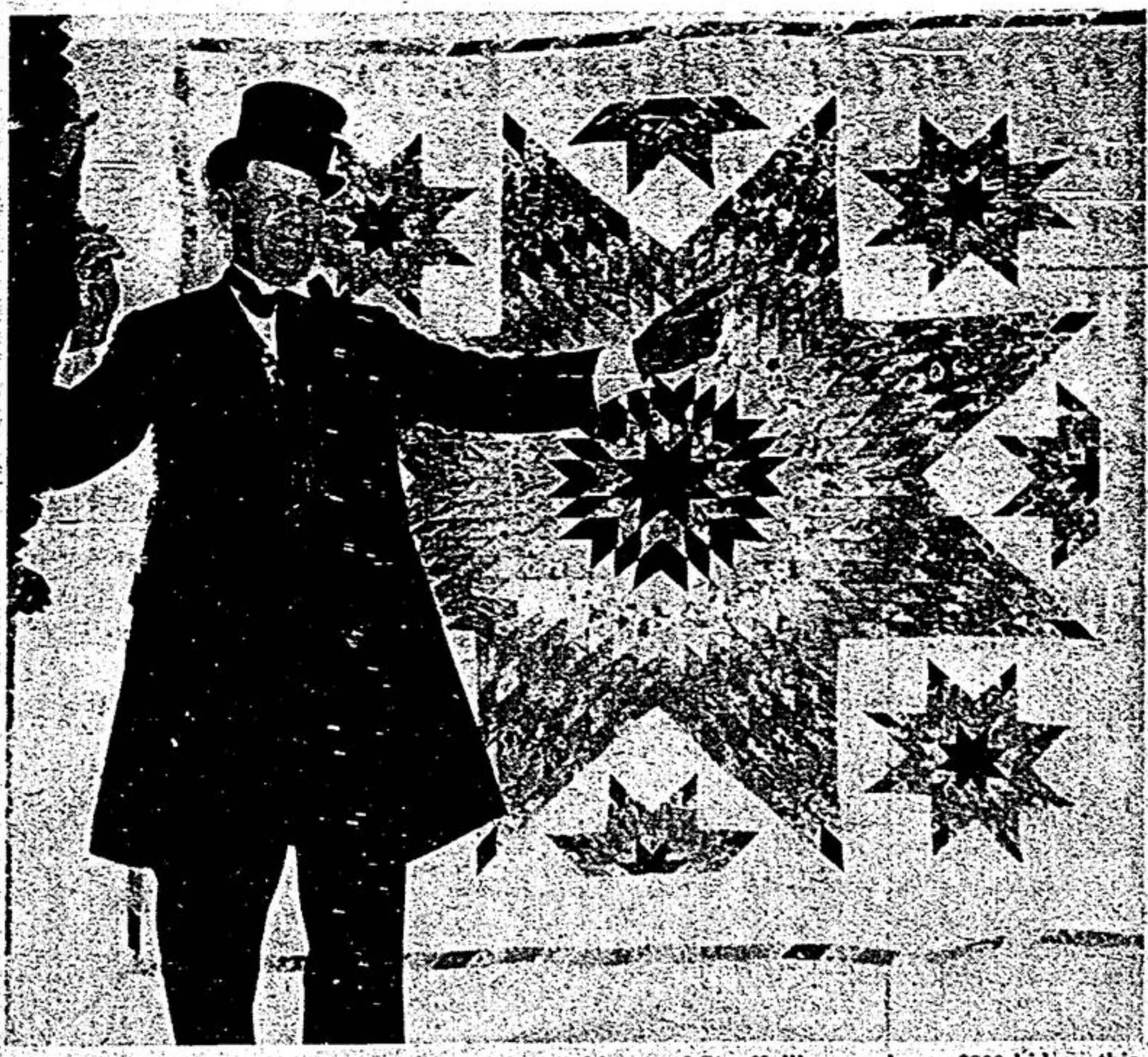
Pioneer Festival Profit-near \$9,000

PIONEER VILLAGE — Hundreds — maybe thousands, strolled up and down the 'avenues' of Black Creek Pioneer Village, Saturday. The event was the annual Mennonite Festival, with many of the participants from the Stouffville, Gormley and Markham areas.

While there are still some outstanding accounts, organizers anticipate a profit on the day of close to \$9,000. The money goes to help alleviate poverty in

countries around the world. The quilt auction was a main attraction, with Walter Atkinson, resembling a 'caller' from the pioneer past, disposing of 60 hand-made donations. The highest bid was \$200.

While rain threatened attendance in the morning, the skies cleared and the people poured in. The 800 pies and 1,000 loaves of bread found ready sale. Of particular interest were the spelling bees, a class for juniors and one for seniors, held outside the old Dickson's Hill School, now re-located at the Black Creek site. The 'teacher' in charge was Allison Hughes.

Husband-wife killed

Two persons were killed and three injured Sept. 17 at 6:50 p.m. on Highway 11 at the Gormley-Stouffville Road. Dead are Jack Partridge, 52, and his wife Evelyn, 49, of Port Credit. Their son Peter, 16, sustained minor injuries as did the other driver Michele Patruo, 26, of Willowdale, and his passenger, Frank Palarmo, 23, of Willowdale.

The collision occurred when Mr. Patruo, who was southbound on Highway 11 turned left to go east on the Gormley Road and was struck by the northbound Partridge vehicle. Investigating officer Frank Clark estimated damage to vehicles at \$4,000. Mr. Patruo has been charged with careless driving and an improper left turn.

Councillor's job "not a hobby"

Keith Scott, a candidate for local councillor in Ward 2 of Uxbridge Township, has charged that the job of councillor should not be treated as a hobby, but rather as a business. He feels that councillors should be vocal about the wishes of his constituents and should keep them well
