

Bob Nesbitt - he's known to everyone

UXBRIDGE TWP. Voters won't see any campaign posters promoting Robert L. Nesbitt for Mayor of the new area municipality of Uxbridge Twp. for Bob, reeve of the present township supports legislation that would ban permanent signs that add to the pollution of the environment.

Bob Nesbitt is probably well-known in any case, not only in his own area but in Scott and Uxbridge Town where he will also be campaigning for votes against his mayoralty opponent, Dr. Carl Puterbaugh. He has served 18 years as councillor, deputy-reeve and reeve of Uxbridge

Twp. 14 years on Ontario County Council, and been active in wide-ranging farming and civic affairs throughout these years. With this background, the reeve asserts, "I feel I have the experience to make Regional government work."

Mr. Nesbitt is married with three children and four grandchildren. He and his wife Muriel live on their 300-acre farm in Uxbridge Township.

Norm Lyons, reeve of Scott Township, is another candidate who feels that past experience in municipal and county politics will be a major asset to representatives under the new regional

setup. He has been 5 years on Scott Council; four as deputy reeve. As a candidate for Regional Council, Reeve Lyons, a farmer from Leaskdale, must be elected at large.

Opposing the reeve for the seat on Regional Council is Bill Ballinger a young Uxbridge Town councillor. He is a teacher turned sales

representative and, although this is his first year on the political scene, he has been active in local organizational work, particularly with the youth of the community.

The only woman candidate running for election is Eleanor Todd who is completing her first year on Uxbridge

Twp. Council. Mrs. Todd, a widow with three daughters, has resided in Goodwood for 18 years, and teaches at R.H. Cornish Public School, Port Perry.

"It disturbed me," Mrs. Todd says, "that so few candidates were coming forward for this election, wards would be won by acclamation."

This finally precipitated her decision to run again. As Ward 1 representative, Mrs. Todd wishes to continue her fight for the preservation of the rural identity of the area.

Mrs. Todd's opposition in Ward 1 is George Harvie, a fellow councillor who served the municipality in 1970 as well as this year. Semi-retired from real-estate activities, Mr. Harvie submits that it's of primary importance that a representative on the new Council be prepared to devote at least two days a week to municipal affairs. "I have the time," he concludes.

Keith Scott is in the three-way race for the Ward 2 electoral seat against two Scott Twp. councillors. A lithographer who works in Toronto, he has resided on the Scott-Uxbridge south townline, where he also works a small acreage, for a number of years.

The Ward 3 seat will be contested by two area farmers. Mausty McKnight who lives just north of Leaskdale and James Wilson whose dairy farm is 4 miles north of Uxbridge.

Mr. McKnight, a Scott councillor for 3 years also served 1-year terms on Planning Board and Committee of Adjustment.

Mr. Wilson sat on Council 6 years prior to 1973. Wards 4 and 5, which include the north and south sections of Uxbridge Town, will fall by acclamation to Fred Kelland and Joe Esmonde.

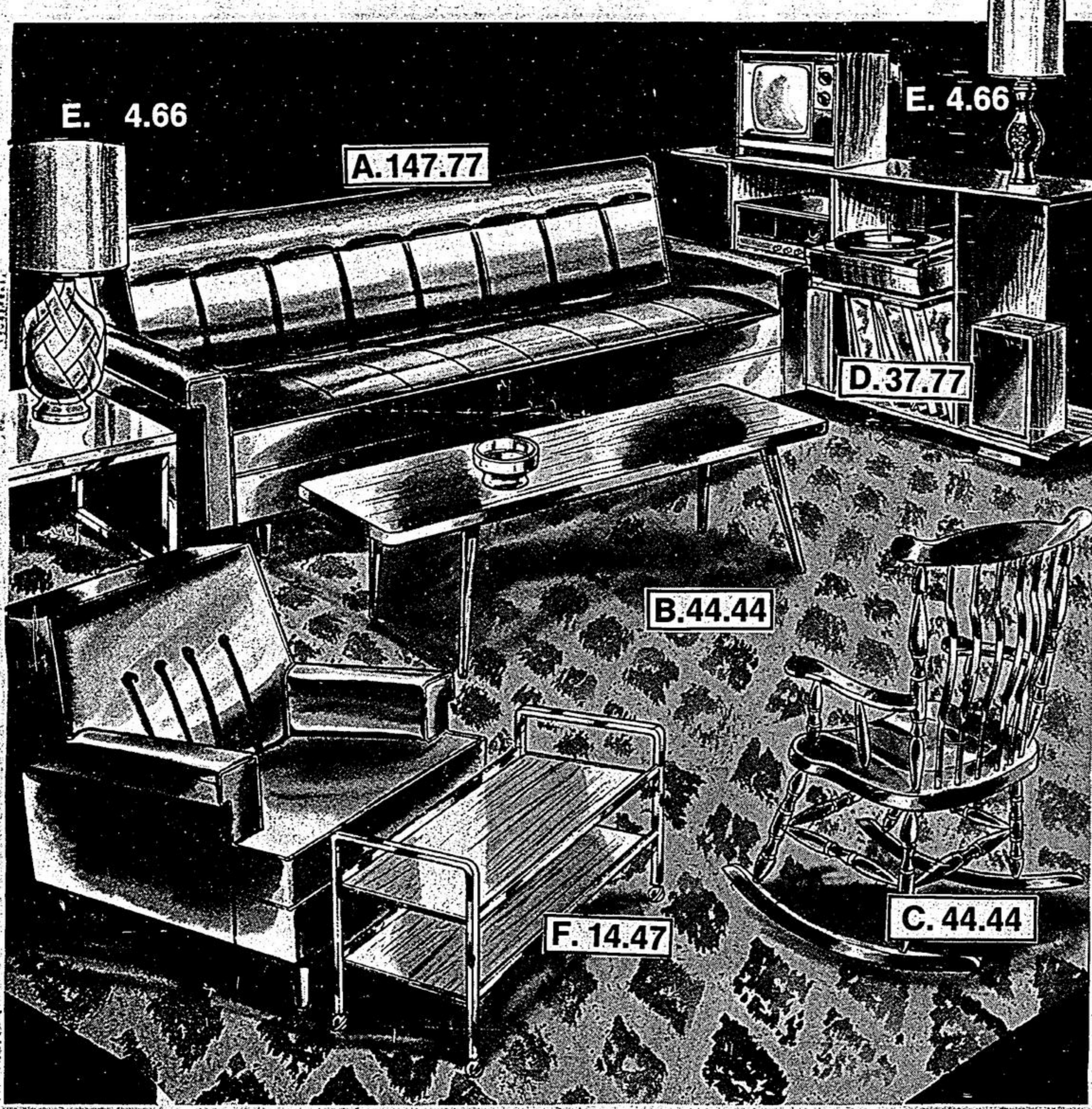
