

Provincial subsidy necessary -- Mayor

The Province has withdrawn financial support of the Family Life Service, now operating in the Region of York. At present, there are five branch offices in Markham, Richmond Hill, Aurora, Newmarket and Georgina. Should the Region assume the total cost or let the program drop?

According to Mayor Gordon Ratcliff, there are many at the regional level who support the service, and feel it is doing an excellent work. There are others who feel there's a limit to the amount of money that can be spent on social welfare.

To operate the program to its fullest extent could cost \$175,000, the Mayor explained. He said this amount had been reduced to \$70,000 in '73

with an additional \$15,000 added to see the Service through to the end of December. He said a committee report was being prepared for Council discussion.

Mr. Ratcliff feels the program should be subsidized by the Province. "The cost is too great for the Region to carry alone," he said.

Question: Will occupancy permits be held up in the Baycrest Subdivision until the new water main is installed through the former Booth farm, south of Main?

Answer: No occupancy permits will be issued until water is available through the new main. A start on this work is to be made this week with the total cost anticipated at \$37,000. Of this amount, \$50,000 will be paid by Baycrest. For

householders to hook into existing mains would tax the pressure in the East End of town.

Question: Has the Town any policy with regard to exits and entrances on the Bloomington Road?

Answer: The Town does not have such a policy. Rather, we deal with each application on its own merits. With regard to any development at the Bloomington corner, I feel the exit should be at the Ninth, and also onto Hwy. 48, for development there. The intersection of Bloomington Road and Hwy. 48, is to be completely changed, eliminating the hill to the north. I also intend to put pressure on the Region to improve the night-lighting at the intersection of Bloomington Road and the Ninth.

Bell wants Bethesda rates raised

Bell Canada reported this week to the Canadian Transport Commission that Toronto and four other exchanges on the edge of Metro have outgrown their present rate groups.

If the CTC orders the upgrouping, basic monthly rates for private line residence customers in Toronto, Thornhill, Streetsville and Clarkson would increase by 60 cents; Bethesda exchange customers would pay 40 cents more.

Telephone rates for any exchange are governed by the number of telephones in its local calling area. This is in recognition of the principle that the value of service to each customer increases as the number of telephones increases.

Bell emphasized that these proposed rate changes are a result of local telephone growth and are not related to the Company's application for a general rate increase which is now before the Canadian Transport Commission.
