Mrs. Marquis has served in many capacities related to church work and Christian outreach. When time permits she goes beyond the pulpit to reach an even wider audience through radio and television. "I never say No when I can say Yes," she says.

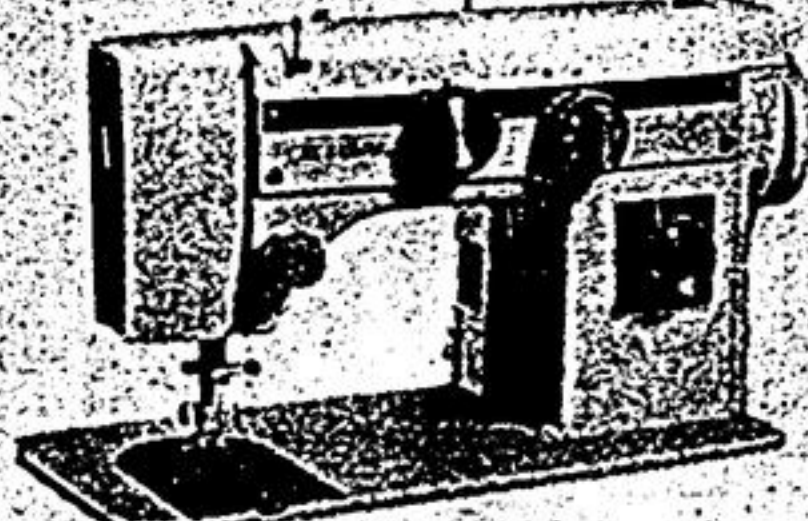
