A country girl

BLOOMINGTON — "Give me land, lots of land... don't fence me in." Those words, remembered by many from out of the '30's, are just as popular today with 16 year old Susan Storry of Bloomington. Why? Because Susan's a vivacious country girl who wants no other way of life. She's The Tribune's Teen Pick of the Week. Susan feels she has everything that any girl could want or need. If it's swimming, there's a spring-fed pond only two dozen steps from her house. If it's riding, she can choose between two beautiful horses named 'Velvet' and 'Lady'. In the winter, she can charge off through the fields on the family snowmobile. The city, she says, is okay, but I like the farm and I think I always will. But Susan's love of country life may be interrupted if she follows through on a secretarial career. Following completion of Grade 12, she hopes to enroll at Seneca College and take a course related to police work. "What I'd really

like to be is a mounted policeman, but if that's not possible, I'll gladly work as a secretary in a police office", she says. Susan, now in Grade 11, is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Noel Storry, R. 2, Stouffville. She has two sisters, Dianne (Mrs. Kenneth Silcox), Toronto, and Marlene (Mrs. Barry Nicholson), R. R. 1, Unionville.

She attained her elementary education at Bloomington and Ringwood Public Schools, moving over to S. D. S. S., for Grades 7 and 8. Basketball and badminton are two of her favorite indoor sports. She's a member of the Adult-Badminton Club that plays at the High School every Monday night.

Library fund raising not new to Stouffville

STOUFFVILLE — There is a long history of fund raising campaigns for the Stouffville library. In nineteenth century Canada it was the working class associations which agitated for public libraries. Stouffville had its own "Mechanics' Institute" with 3,000 volumes and in 1895 "all persons of good character" were invited to a sing-song on Victoria's Birthday to raise money for the library. The library membership fee was \$1 a year. Today membership is free and there are 7,000 more volumes.
