STOUFFVILLE - April of 1974 will mark the Stouffville Horticultural Society's 50th anniversary as an organization in town.

The president for this occasion will be Mrs. Alex Ratcliff, Stouffville, R.R. 2. Mrs. Ratcliff was re-elected to the position at a year-end pot luck supper, last week. The vice-president is Win Timbers; treasurer, Mrs. Frank Burkholder; and secretary, Charles James.

The Society had a very successful term in '73, although membership is down by 37 from 1972.

The landscaping project at Parkview Home was continued. Two hundred petunias were planted in the spring and 150 tulip bulbs in the fall.

For a first time, District 5 held its Flower Show in Stouffville, extending over two days, in the Arena. There were approximately 700 entries; 70 of these from Stouffville. Local members received 27 prizes.

At its concluding meeting, tribute was paid to the work of Miss Margery Mertens, secretary of the organization 37 years, and a member up to the time of her passing, Aug. 14. "She will long be remembered for her faithful service", read the directors' annual report.

The minister and congregation will be responsible for the format of the worship held in his own church, with each extending from 30 minutes to an hour in duration. The Friday worship, Jan. 11 in the Bethel Assembly of God, co-incides with a pre-arranged film, 'Thief in the Night', with the result this service will last about 1 1/2 hours.
