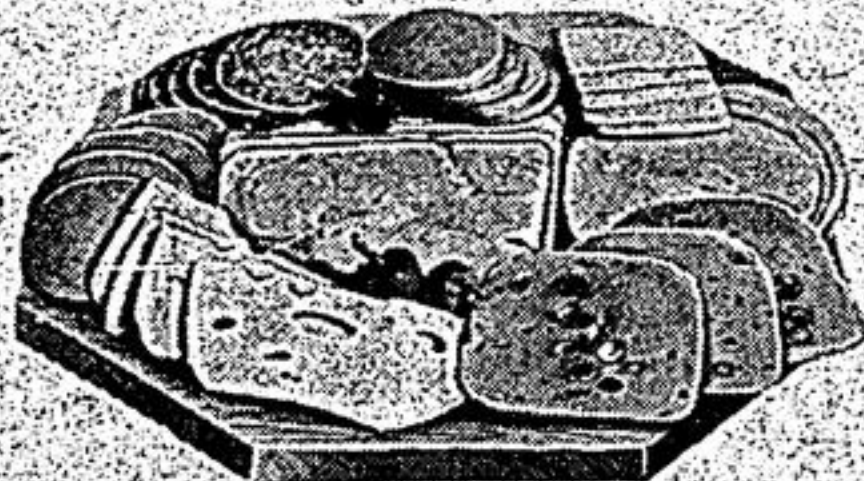

Teacher training courses offered

Individuals wishing to prepare themselves for a teaching career in an elementary school may apply for admission to a teachers' college or to a university faculty of education. The affiliation of most teachers' colleges with Ontario universities is likely to occur over the next few years.

To qualify for the basic one-year course leading to elementary school teacher certification in Ontario, an applicant must submit evidence of successful completion of an approved university degree in Arts or Science or a degree deemed equivalent.

There are six universities offering the one-year program: Brock, Lakehead, Ottawa, Toronto, Windsor and York. Three of the previously mentioned universities—Windsor, York and Lakehead also offer a four-year program in which three years are directed towards a B. A. or B. Sc. degree and the fourth year is comprised of professional teacher training towards a B. Ed. degree.
