### 'Model' teenager

STOUFFVILLE — Is there a model teenager in Whitchurch-Stouffville? Most parents would reply with an unqualified "yes"; including Mr. and Mrs. Peter Walley, 438 Main Street East. However, for them, the term 'model' has a double meaning. For their second daughter, Cathy, now 17, has chosen modelling as a career. She's enrolled at the Eleanor Fulcher Modelling School, Toronto and attends classes there every Saturday. At the same time, she's continuing her studies at S.D.S.S., and hopes to complete Grade 12.

While Stouffville is 'home' to Cathy, she comes originally from Jackson's Point. She has one brother, John, 22, and a sister, Linda (Mrs. Tom Benson), operator of Linda's Hairstylists on Main Street.

While modelling is a glamorous career, Cathy already knows the dedication and patience required to be successful. She started, what are called, 'self-improvement classes' in November and expects to complete this phase of the course in April. She considers this kind of instruction excellent. ### Council approached on 200 acres

UXBRIDGE — Gerry Meharg sought council's feelings on the development of 200 acres west of the town of Uxbridge, at a township council meeting Jan. 17. He also discussed township buying land and there for a new administration centre.

## French immersion course Parents to comment

YORK CTY. — Parents of children who will be in kindergarten or Grade 1 next September are being asked to advise the York County Board of Education if they would be interested in having their children educated in French immersion classes.

A French Immersion Committee set up by the board over a year ago submitted a lengthy report November 26, 1973. It recommended a French Immersion Program which would have the Ontario elementary school curriculum taught in French only, in the first years of elementary school and in both French and English in more advanced grades. Such a program should start in kindergarten, the committee suggested. Its goal would be to produce students able, by the end of their elementary schooling, to succeed with equal ease in studies or other activities conducted in either English or French.

A feasibility committee, under the chairmanship of Superintendent of Planning and Development Stephen Baccalmasi, is investigating the financial and curricular implications of such a program. Its first concern is to establish how many prospective pupils there would be for such a program.

The current issue of the board's newsletter CONTACT will include a form to be completed and returned by parents interested in a French immersion program for their children.

## Raises approved for Council

PICKERING — In spite of a call for further study by Councillor Don Kitchen, Pickering Council unanimously voted a raise of \$2,000 for the mayor and \$1,500 for each councillor.

That puts the mayor's stipend at \$12,000, while each councillor will receive \$5,000 for 1974.

Mayor George Ashe opened the meeting to questions from the audience, but only six people remained in the gallery. The spectators declined comment until after Councillor Kitchen asked for deferral. Then three spoke up.

One opposed the raise and two favored the increase. Councillor Kitchen favored a system where the councillor would get an automatic raise every year for the three-year term.

Councillors Jack Anderson and Alex Robertson detailed their workload, which averaged four meetings a week.

"I don't feel the figure of \$5,000 a year is too high," Councillor Anderson said.

Mayor Ashe said increased public interest in municipal government makes more demands on a council member's time.

He added that the increases compare well with those granted in Brock, Whitby and Newcastle.

## No change in user fees

YORK CTY. — In spite of the fact that fees charged for the use of schools by outside bodies recovered only 25 per cent of the board's costs for such use, there will, at present, be no change in the fee structure.

On a motion of Trustee Craig Cribar, it was agreed that there be no change in permit rates until Policy 39 is revised but that all organizations which had permits last year should be advised of the board's intent to revise Policy 39.

When the fee structure was adopted a year ago it was expected that it would permit the board to recoup 50 per cent of its costs. It was planned to increase the fees this year so that 75 per cent of expenditures could be recovered. A staff report indicated that reduced revenues and increased costs resulted from greater uses by continuing groups and more caretaking time than anticipated. No attempt had been made to forecast revenues for 1974 but it is anticipated that costs will be higher because of increased costs of labour, fuel, power and supplies.

Some trustees felt that costs for public use of the schools, should be moved to extraordinary expenditures (on which no grant would be received) but where they would not come under expenditure ceilings.
