Diploma requirements at SDSS

The diploma requirements at SDSS are basically those set down by the Ministry of Education.

The ministry requires that each student, in order to qualify for a Secondary School Graduation Diploma, shall fulfil the following: 1) accumulate a minimum of 27 credits; 2) obtain a minimum of 3 credits in each of 4 areas of study. These are Communications, Social and Environmental Studies, Physical and Applied Sciences, and Arts; 3) accumulate at least 4 credits in English and 2 in Canadian Studies.

At SDSS a student must select an English course in each of years 1, 2, 3 and 4 and in both years 1 and 2 select at least 1 credit from each of the four areas of study. He may complete the remaining requirements in years 3 and 4.

A further 6 credits, at the year-5 level, are required if a student wishes to obtain a Secondary School Honour Graduation Diploma. Please consult the Guidance Department, telephone 640-1433 if you have questions regarding student program choice for 1974-75.
