## Well-loved Parkview resident passes

**STOUFFVILLE** — Susanna Darlington, resident at Parkview Home for the past six and a half years, died Saturday Feb. 2 at the age of 88.

Born near Belfast, Ireland, Susanna Kelly, she was brought by her parents to Canada at the age of two, after a 6-week Atlantic steamer voyage. The Kelly family settled in "Cabbagetown", Toronto, and Susie was the eldest daughter in the Kelly family of five daughters and one son, Tom, killed in World War 1. The family attended Parliament Street Methodist Church where Susie took an active part

(then located at the corner of Leslie Street and Lawrence Avenue) where Mrs. Darlington was active in the W. M. S. and Ladies Aid work and as a Sunday School Superintendent.

**MARKHAM** — They might not look like hair, or feel like hair, but to dermatologists nails are very much like hair. And skin for that matter.

Composed of keratin (the stuff of skin and hair), nails grow out of the body and are dependent on the body for nourishment. Thus they often reflect its general health.

Nail ailments — If your nails are less than beautiful, it could mean a problem with your overall physical condition.

Corrugated or furrowed nails, for example, are often the result of an illness, a major operation, or a problem with the nail itself. Injury and disease can also cause nails to become thick and overgrown or to weaken and wither away.

While it's up to you and your doctor to keep your health in order, a good manicurist can put ailing nails into order.

Nails can be retextured with buffing or abrasion. They can be strengthened and lubricated with conditioners and oils. Splits and cracks can be repaired. And, if need be, brand new nails can be permanently attached right over your old ones.

Nail care — Often enough, however, poor nails are the result of improper care. Soft nails or brittle nails could be the result of too much detergent, too much water, or excessive use of nail polish remover. That's right. Polish removers
