Minnie still lives in the little house beside the store, or was there the last we saw her this past fall.

Next door is the Topper house. Mr. and Mrs. Kit Topper lived out their full span of years in this house. Kit was also a railroad man. Section foreman. Kit Topper will long be remembered in Locust Hill for his car. He had an old black Ford. Went everywhere in it. He gave more people grey hairs than everyone else in the community combined.

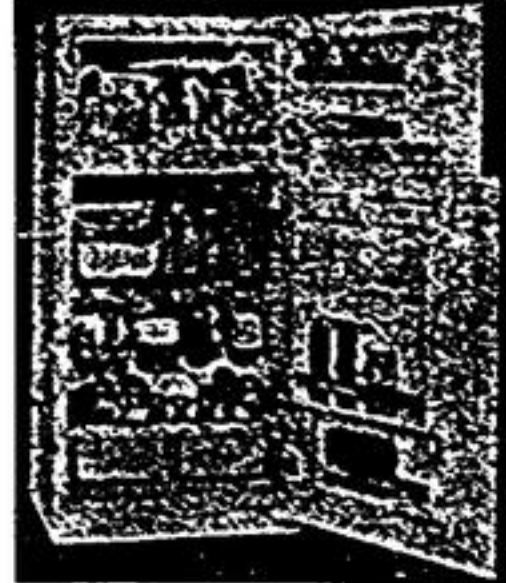

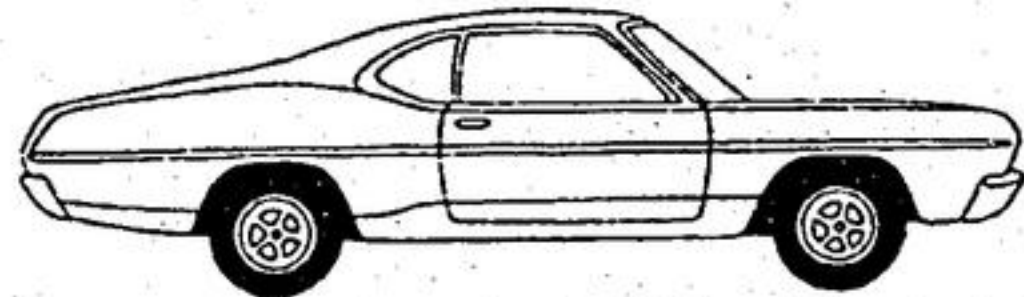
