

'Drug Day' in court

Standing room crowd

YORK REGION — The third Friday of each month is 'Drug Day' in Newmarket Provincial Court.

All offences involving illegal drug use, are channeled into this date. On Feb. 15, it was standing-room-only, with over 140 cases listed on the docket.

Paul Lawrence Marshall, 23 of Newmarket, appeared in a wheelchair. He was convicted on a charge of possession of marijuana and fined \$50. Similar charges against three companions were withdrawn.

James Fitzpatrick and Raymond Wirtaning, both 21, of Richmond Hill were also fined \$50 each. Police testified they uncovered a quantity of marijuana on searching an apartment. Charges against four others were dropped.

Richard Osborne, 17, of Markham, admitted police had found marijuana in his sock, when they searched him, Jan. 19. He was fined \$50.

A Richmond Hill taxi driver pleaded guilty to possession of marijuana, after police nabbed him, Feb. 8. Terrence William MacDonald, 22, told the Court he kept a supply of the drug in a shirt pocket.

Paul Joseph Enger, 21, of Richmond Hill was charged with marijuana possession, Jan. 25. Police entered his home with a search warrant. He was fined \$50.

James Phillip Bowen of Aurora pleaded guilty to trafficking in marijuana. He had a pound of the drug in his possession when questioned at the High School. He was remanded to March 15 for a pre-sentence report. Maurice Stanley Halsted of Stouffville pleaded not guilty to a charge of possession of marijuana for the purpose of trafficking. Halsted claimed the drug was for his own use and not for sale. He pleaded guilty to a lesser charge of possession only and was fined \$50.

David Grant McLean, 18, of Markham admitted selling an illicit drug (L.S.D.), at Sibbald's Point, "to make a fast buck". The court learned, however, that since the arrest, McLean had changed his lifestyle

and was now in a new home with new friends. Judge Clare Morrison requested a pre-sentence report.

Michael Gordon Sward, 18, of Newmarket, was charged with drug trafficking but pleaded guilty only to possession. He was fined \$50. Police said they found a quantity of marijuana in his home. On a second charge of marijuana possession at Newmarket High School, Sward was fined an additional \$50. The drug, police said, was in his car.

Randal Richardson, 18, of Gormley; Denton Edward Hutchinson, 20, of R. R. 1, Newmarket; and William James Arris, 19, of Kitchener, were fined \$100 each on a charge of trafficking in marijuana. The drug, police said, was found in a house at Newmarket.

When police stopped a truck driven by a 21 year old Aurora man, they found 2½ pounds of marijuana in the vehicle, according to evidence in

Court. Michael John Trussler was remanded in custody to March 15 for sentence.

Two men chose trial by Judge and Jury on charges of trafficking in marijuana. Donald Barclay James Rice of Gormley and Peter Michael Chitty of Richmond Hill will appear in a Toronto Court. Ten pounds of the drug was found in a Bugar Bar on Don Mills Road, police said.

A new drug, called P.C.P., has hit the illicit market according to evidence in Court, Friday. Police said they followed a car on Dunning Avenue, Aurora, and witnessed occupants throwing 'something' from the window. They recovered the contents and charged Frank Strote of Newmarket with possession. The accused, age 18, was sentenced to three days in jail and fined \$115. The Court was told that P.C.P. had been on the 'market' about eight months.

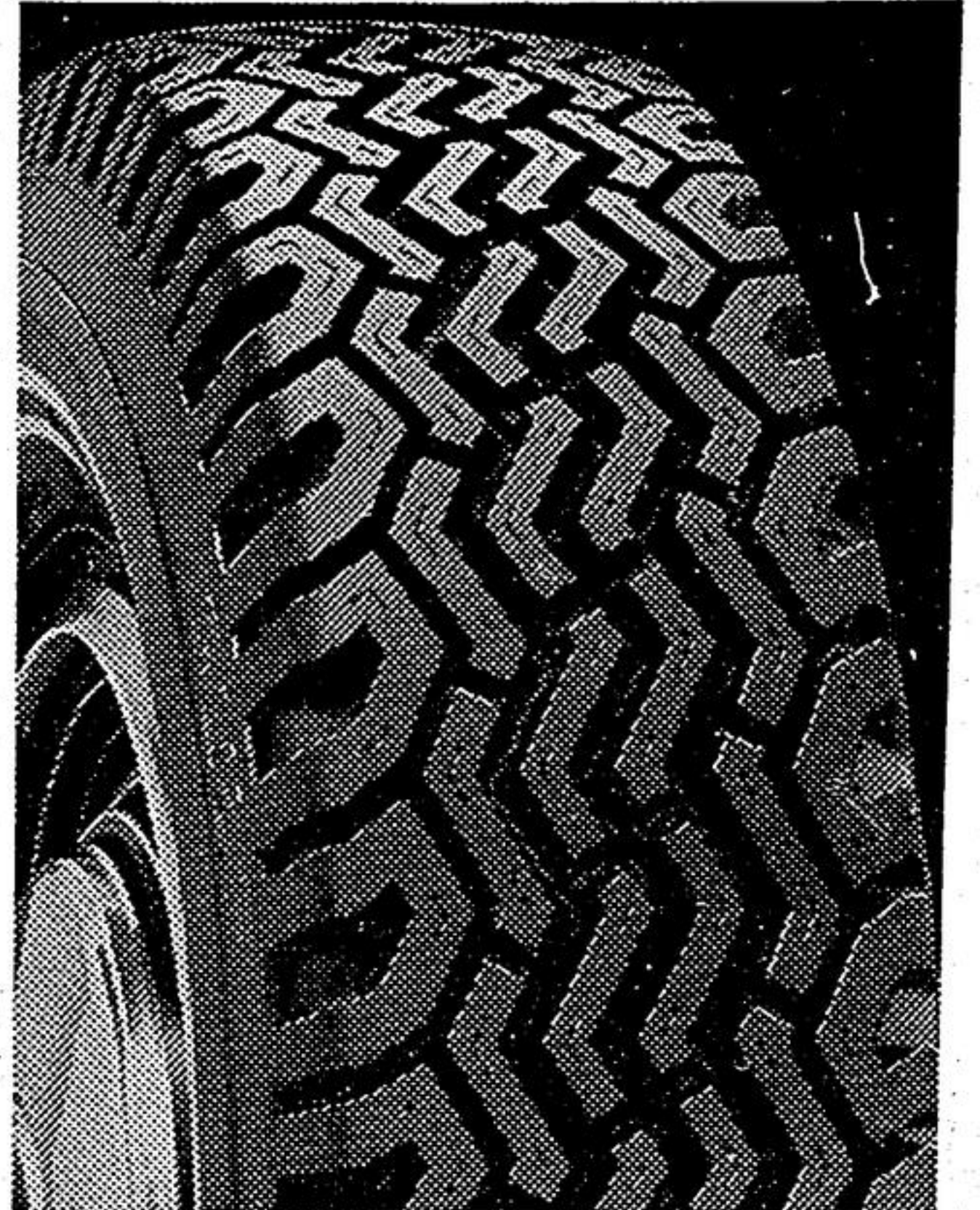
