Powerful message Attendance good for week-long crusade

STOUFFVILLE—With an average attendance of 300 over the seven days Rev. John Hamilton said he was, "very pleased with the results," of a week-long crusade held by the Stouffville Missionary Church last week.

The largest group attended Saturday evening when 375 were present, "the attendance was better than I had anticipated." Rev. Hamilton added that there had been, "an excellent spirit of co-operation among the churches in the area."

Friday night Evangelist Alf Rees gave a straight-forward but powerful message, "You must be born again."

A large crowd with a goodly number of young people attended and a number responded to the altar-call given at the end of service. After songs by the choir and a presentation by singer Art Perri, Mr. Rees gave his message.

who were born again believers, "must know it for sure. If you are not sure, you should be." Mr. Rees cited John 3:8 which compares the spirit of God to the wind, "this is a mystery, can you explain to me the direction of the wind and where it comes from." "If the wind of the spirit passes over this congregation, there will be a hurricane-like transformation from the kingdom of Satan to the kingdom of Christ," the evangelist added.

He said that people were afraid of what others think and might be reluctant to come forward but added, "when you walk out of this building tonight you will know clearly whether you are born again or not." He said that being born again of the Spirit was the only way to heaven, not being the member of a church and taking part in church activities.
