A beautiful incident in the life of Queen Victoria is worth remembering. One day she asked her chaplain, "Can one be absolutely certain in this life of eternal life?" His answer was that he "knew of no way one could be absolutely sure."

This was published in the Court News and came to the attention of a humble minister of the Gospel, John Townsend. He wrote the Queen the following letter.

"To Her Gracious Majesty, our beloved Queen Victoria, from one of her most humble subjects: With trembling hands but heart filled love, and because I know that we can be ab-

solutely sure of eternal life in the Home that Jesus went to prepare, may I ask your Majesty to read the following passages of Scripture, John 3:16, Romans 10:9 and 10. These passages prove, there is full assurance of salvation by faith in our Lord Jesus Christ for those who believe and accept his finished work. I sign myself, your servant for Jesus' sake, "John Townsend"

He, with a group of his friends prayed much about this letter to the Queen.

Elderly receive tax break

MARKHAM - Elderly homeowners will receive an additional tax break as a result of legislation passed by Markham Council last week.

The tax credit is available to anyone who owns his home, is over 65, has paid residential property taxes in Markham for five years and receives a guaranteed income supplement from the government.

Council voted to give the maximum credit allowable under provincial guidelines which amounts to \$100.

The plan could cost the municipality a maximum of \$30,000.

Ward 5 councillor, Alma Walker felt that the legislation was "too little, too late," but "is a step in the right direction."

Councillor for Ward 1, Gary Kay expressed the opinion that this type of legislation is discriminatory to young people, "who have to try and buy houses on this inflated market and also pay higher tax assessments."
