While the Stouffville defence suffered occasional lapses, coach Eldon Wagg praised their efforts over the sixty minutes, in particular the work of Don Norton. He called him "outstanding."

It was the same Don Norton who missed on a penalty shot in the second period, but came back to score in the third. "Heck," said Eldon, "what's that?" On a penalty shot, a guy's got only one man to beat, but on a legitimate goal, he's got six."

Kevin Barrick fired three real goals for Stouffville, and John Meakes' second drive was a 170 footer into an empty net, with the Unionville blocker on the bench.

Mike Spink, Steve Bolingbroke, and Gordon Bince lit the lamp for the losers.

Finley Macdonald collected two assists, but was forced out of action early when he slashed across the leg by a Roman lancer. Fortunately the injury was a bad bruise and not a break.
