## "Your (beep) number please!"

STOUFFVILLE — In an attempt to speed up customer-dialed long distance calls, Bell Canada is introducing a special "beep" tone in the Stouffville, Claremont, Bethesda and Gormley

exchanges on March 31. The "beep" is a signal to the caller to give his own number. It saves the Operator having to ask for it and speeds up the call for the customer. The above exchanges

have what is called Operator Number Identification (ONI) service. It means that long distance billing procedures are not completely automated and an Operator still has to come on the line to take the caller's number.

Operator will ask for the number, as before. A benefit to the Operator is the avoiding of the repetitive "your number please". All other billing information for direct distance dialed calls is recorded automatically including the called number, length of call and time of day.
