

## Large ratepayer turnout

UXBRIDGE — Over 200 people filled the Uxbridge Music Hall March 28 for the formation of the Uxbridge Ratepayers Association, surpassing all expectations of the organizers.

Stan Carroll was elected president of the group which heavily represented Scott Township and the town of Uxbridge.

Chairman of the meeting was Roland Hudson and he set the tone by giving some of his ideas on why the association was being formed.

He cited the advent of regional government as the main reason, "regional government has brought many changes, and it is difficult for people to adjust to change."

"The ratepayers association would help us through this period of re-orienting ourselves to regional government's complexity", Mr. Hudson said.

He saw the group as a help and support to the elected council, not an opposition group, "if there are legitimate beefs, we would try to do something about them."

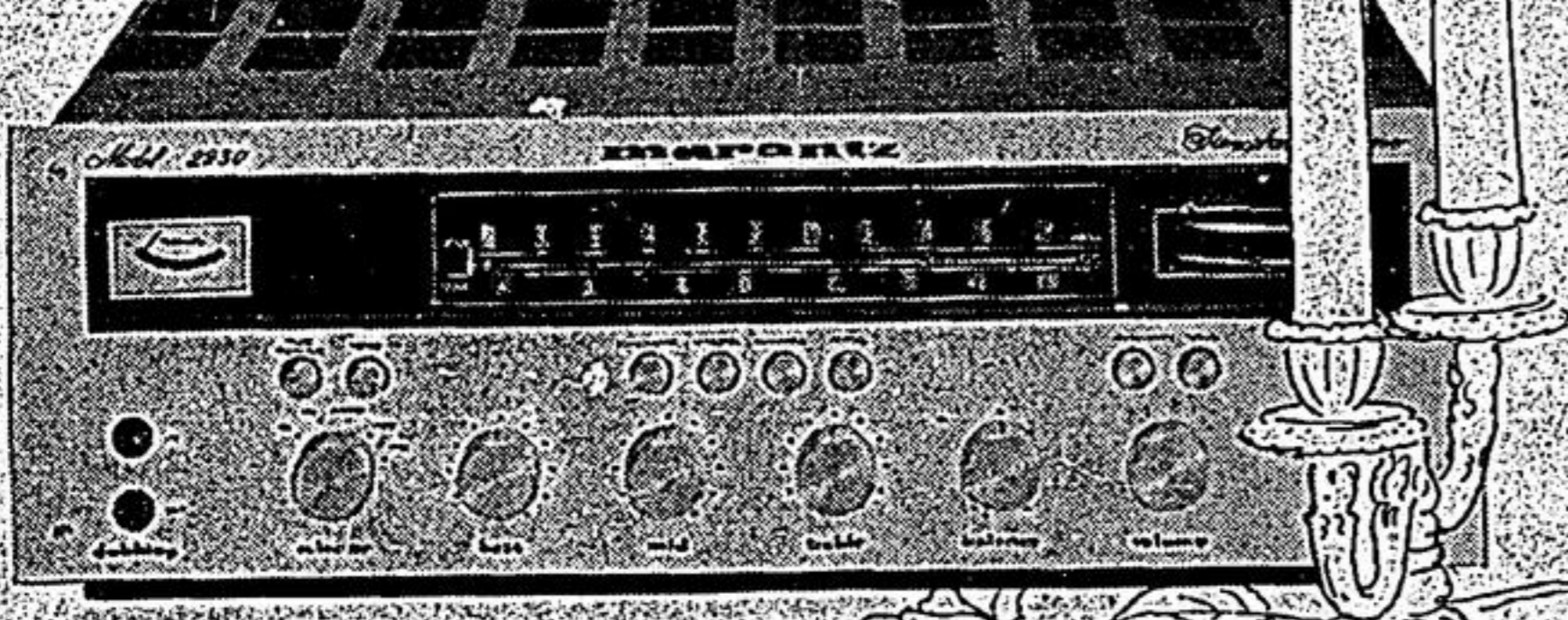
## School fire

With students outside, the gymnasium suddenly went up in flames. The school was closed Tuesday, but was expected to be open today. Ontario Fire Marshal's office is investigating.

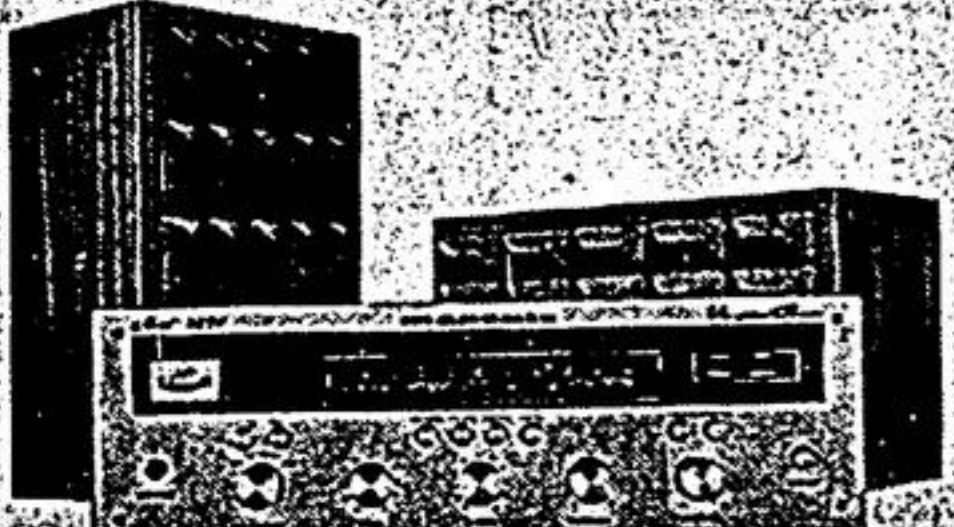
