Local group moving to develop parkland

STOUFFVILLE — A committee had spoken to the Council recently about it and had introduced some excellent ideas. He suggested that the work could be done better by the local Authority than by Metro. "I feel it should be a place for people to go for a walk and enjoy nature," he said. The mayor said he was opposed to swimming at the site but felt two or three picnic tables in the area would prove a benefit.

Question: What stand will the Town take re the Industrial Zone on the north side of the Vivian Sideroad at Cedar Valley.

Answer: The Town will support the Bylaw at the O.M.B. Hearing, May 23 and 24, at a Public Hearing before the Ontario Municipal Board in Latham Hall, the mayor said. The time of the Hearing is 10 a.m. While opponents to the plan will be permitted to speak from the floor, the mayor

said, the meeting will maintain certain restrictive as is the case with all Hearings chaired by the O.M.B.

Question: Will residents of Cedar Valley be required to retain a solicitor to speak on their behalf against the proposed industrial park?

Answer: The mayor said he had advised the Cedar Valley delegation that a lawyer could be helpful, but not absolutely necessary. He said that all persons opposed to industrial build-up in that area would be heard.

Question: Does Council favor concrete construction for the exterior of the new Stouffville Post Office?

Answer: Council has agreed to permit a concrete exterior rather than brick, the mayor said. A charge at this time would set back the building's completion date several weeks since brick is in short supply. The mayor said cement block was now being used in many buildings of this type and should blend in with any future construction in that area.
