Stouffville Birkett-Hassard peewees Consolation trophy winners

STOUFFVILLE — Stouffville's Birkett-Hassard peewees "put it all together as team" Sunday and captured the consolation championship as hosts of the eight-team softball tournament.

They defeated Richmond Hill 10-4 for the consolation title in a well-played game. Earlier in the day, they had lost 4-2 to Willowdale, then

came up with a 9-2 victory over Owen Sound.

The tournament was originally scheduled for Saturday, but due to rain was played Sunday.

Stouffville pitcher Jim Chilvers was awarded the Most Valuable Player award for the tournament. He pitched in all three games, and knocked in three runs with a homer against Richmond Hill.

Stouffville's games also featured some superb fielding by outfielders Chris O'Conner, Chris Kamps, and Kevin McGuckin. "They came up with some dazzling catches — really heads-up ball," said Sanderson. While playing Owen Sound, Kamps caught a line-drive on the run and immediately fired the ball to second, catching a man off base for a double

play. That play ended the game.

Jim Chilvers performed a similar feat against Richmond Hill, with a man on first and nobody out. The batter drilled a line drive at Chilvers' head, and Jim got his glove up just in time, made the catch, and threw to first. The Richmond Hill runner was already halfway to second base.

Sanderson also singled out Steve Spang and Mike Mumford as two young men who performed well in the field and at bat.

About the loss to Willowdale, Sanderson said: "They just overpowered us." In the following games, the B-H's reversed the situation and piled up a 5-0 lead in the 2nd inning against Owen Sound; and a 5-0 lead in the 1st inning with Richmond Hill.

At the awards ceremony, Chilvers, who was MVP, was also presented a framed certificate from the OASA for achievements

last summer. Jim pitched three no-hitters; then, including one perfect game.

His teammate Rich Underwood was given a certificate as well — for his no-hitter against Keswick last year.

Mayor Gordon Ratcliff presented the consolation trophy to the B-H's, and Clare McGuckin, manager of the Stouffville Dist. Credit Union, presented the championship trophy to Alderwood.

Manager Sanderson wanted to thank Mr. McGuckin for helping make the tournament possible.
