## Firemen commended for quick response

**STOUFFVILLE** — Council last week received a letter addressed to Mayor Gordon Ratcliff commanding the Town's Volunteer Fire Department. The letter has been reprinted below in its entirety.

Dear Sir:  
I had an opportunity on the evening of July 4, 1974 to observe the Fire Department of our town fighting what could have been a disastrous blaze at Schell Lumber. Had it not been for a combination of speedy response, correct size-up of the situation and an aggressive attack on the fire it is quite possible you may have seen the loss of the entire business area around the lumber company.

I have been a professional firefighter for the past 12 years and I have been involved in several major fires. It is obvious to me that Whitchurch-Stouffville not only has a well trained fire department but also has one which is staffed by a chief officer who has the ability to correctly make attack decisions and an aggressive crew courageous enough to carry out his orders. The attack and extinguishment of the Schell Lumber fire had to be one of the finest pieces of firefighting I have witnessed in some time.

More often than not the residents and leaders of communities have a tendency to criticize the operation of their fire departments. This is due mainly to the fact that the

## Dump rules criticized

**UXBRIDGE** — 'Ridiculous' is how Uxbridge Councillor Mäustyn McKnight described new charges by the Region of Durham at the Scott Township disposal site.

He was referring to the fact that a person bringing garbage to the dump would have to pay \$7 if it was brought in anything larger than a half-ton pickup.

The new charges were advertised last week in the Uxbridge newspaper.

Murray Clarke, who

is in charge of operation

of the dump, appeared at

the council meeting to ask

that the new regulations

be changed.

He said that extended

hours demanded by the

region and increased

paper work would require

at least one full-time

person and possibly two.

Mr. Clarke presently

opens the dump three

days a week and is em-

ployed on a part-time

basis.

"They want us to run

our dump like they do in

the city?" he complained.

He added that rates

are discriminatory

against some people.

People with single axle

dump or stake trucks

have to pay \$7 to dump

their garbage.

Councillor McKnight

said that for many farm-

ers, the only way they

have of bringing garbage

to the dump is with a

stake truck.

"People won't pay
