

Town reservoir to get \$170,000 cover

Whitchurch-Stouffville Council has decided to spend \$170,000 to put a cover on the town's reservoir, located at Baker Hill, north of Stouffville. The problem is debris falling into the reservoir, which has to be disinfected three

times a year at a cost of \$6,000. A floating cover would have cost \$70,000 less to build, but council felt the permanent one would be cheaper in the long run.

NEWMARKET — York Simcoe Liberal candidate Michael Willinsky, 34, was remanded in Newmarket provincial court last week, following a charge of obstructing police. The court date is Sept. 27.

Police claim that the medical research teacher and dentist obstructed Constable Stephen Horvath as he was attempting to place a prisoner in his cruiser outside the Liberal campaign headquarters in Aurora.

Dr. Willinsky is represented by prominent civil rights attorney Clayton Ruby of Toronto.

Attempted to pass cheques

Woman pleads guilty

STOUFFVILLE — A Toronto woman pleaded guilty to false pretences in Newmarket Provincial court recently, involving an attempt to cash worthless cheques at a

Stouffville dry goods store. Michele Paton was charged last December after she obtained goods from Paul's Dry Goods, Main Street, and paid for them with a worthless cheque written on the Bank of Montreal.

Police testified that she had been involved in other such incidents but in each case had made restitution. Judge Clare Morrison was told that Miss Paton had become involved with a man charged with similar offences. The woman's lawyer said she is taking care of nine-month old baby and keeping a rooming house.

Gordon Ratcliff Rezoning could upgrade property

STOUFFVILLE — Mayor Gordon Ratcliff said council is supporting the application of Stouffville Trailer Limited for a spot rezoning. The site is currently zoned agricultural. The mayor explained Council hopes the rezoning will result in a general upgrading of the Hwy 48 and will result, "in the construction of more permanent buildings."

"It still has to go through rezoning with the airport under the minister's freeze zone. It's up to the Minister of Housing."

"Building Inspector, Willis Wideman, has contacted the Humane Society and the York Regional Health Unit and asked them to hold an investigation." The mayor said the Clean Yards By-law will be enforced. "The town could have the old cars (on the property) towed away and then charge it back to the owner or we could take them to court."

Mr. Wideman said he didn't know how much time Mr. Klochhoff would be given to clean up the area. "We like to be fair and ask them how much time they need, within reason."

Milliken expansion approved

MARKHAM — A town within a town. That's what's on the drawing board for Markham if Queen's Park proceeds with development plans both north and south of Steeles Ave.

Councillor Bob Adams, chairman of Markham Planning Committee, described the residential buildup as "pretty huge". He pinpointed the area in Markham as a block of land between Conc. 5 and 7 bordered by Steeles Ave. on the south and the parkway belt on the north.

The development could accommodate up to 28,000 people, he said. "Larger than the old town of Markham, Unionville and the Thornhill put together."

The planning chairman said he was concerned over the fact that Markham's residential - industrial balance could be seriously disrupted if such a project was allowed to proceed without strict controls.

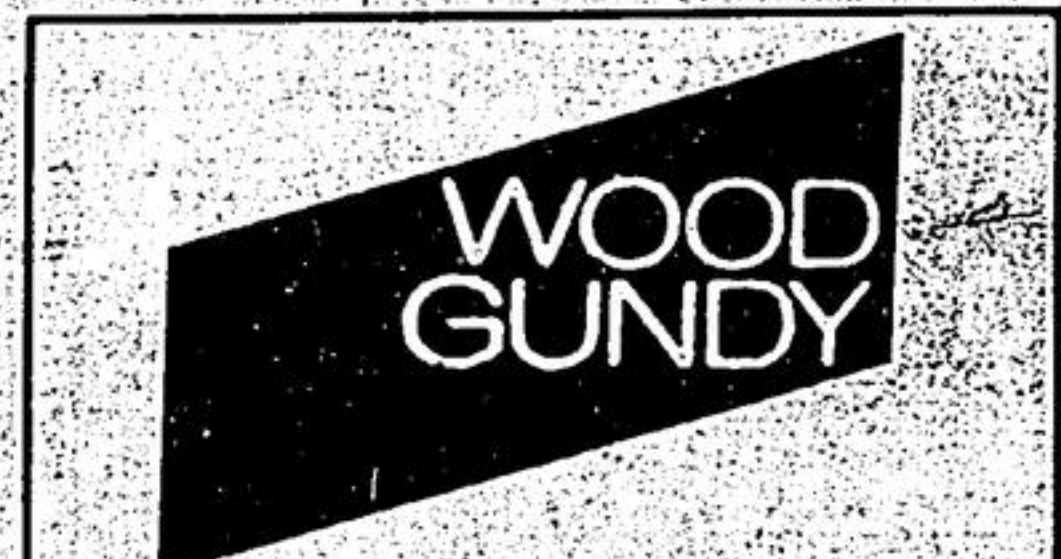

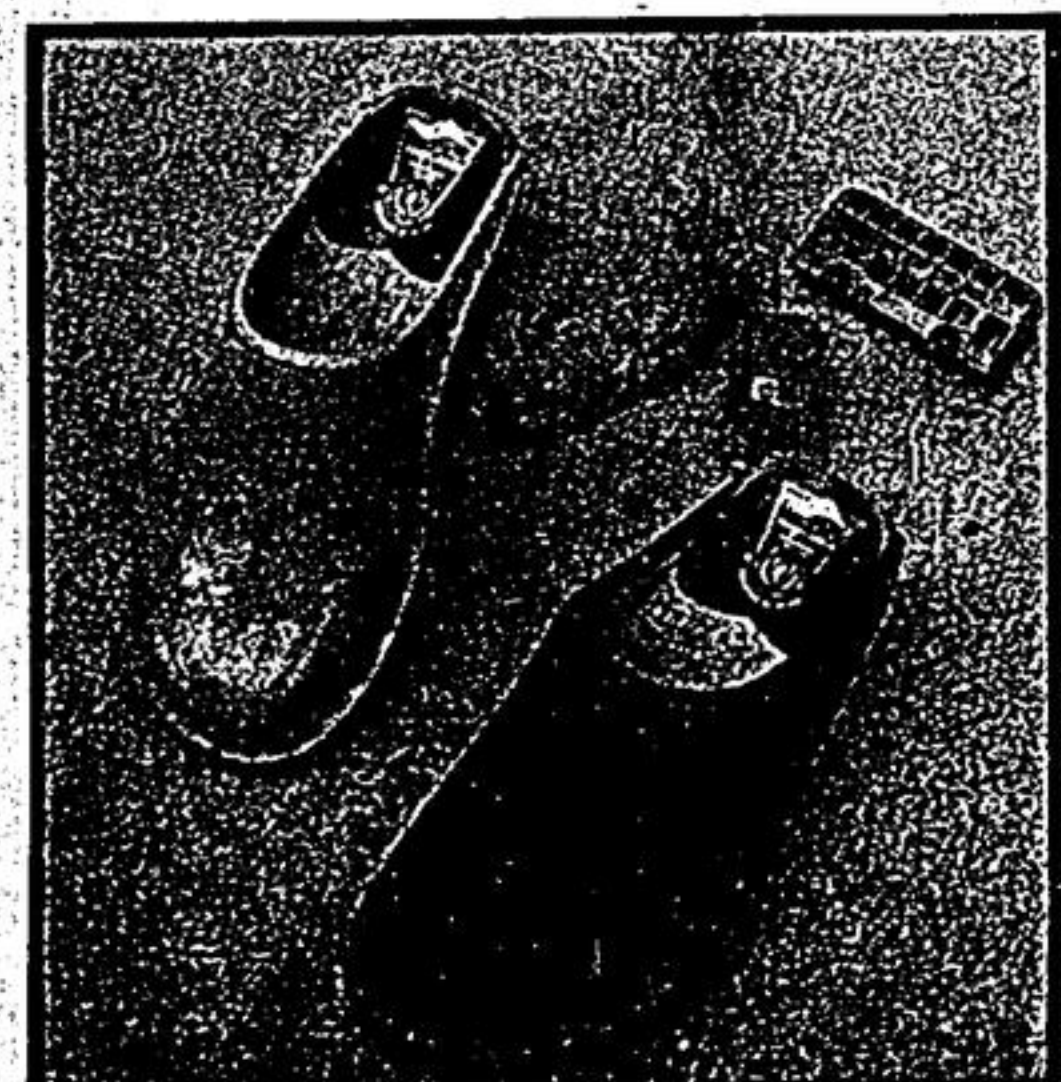
