# 'Mother wasn't too happy'

**GREENWOOD** — When Percy Clarke and Carrie Kellar eloped Aug. 5, 1914, they never dreamed that 60 years later 200 people would gather to commemorate the event.

Sunday Mr. and Mrs. Clarke were the guests of honor at an open house and family dinner celebrating their 60th Anniversary.

Mrs. Clarke explained that "mother wasn't too happy about it," referring to the marriage. The two young people lived on adjoining farms in Hampton, Ontario.

They were married in Trinity Church in Bowmanville. Mr. Clarke was born in Peterboro and moved to Hampton at the age of seven.

The couple moved to Greenwood in 1926 and in 1930 bought a farm not far from their present house at Whetney Rd. and Highway 7. They have lived there since selling the farm in 1954.

They had seven children, although one of them died at the age of two years. Another Reginald is also deceased. Other children include — Evelyn (Mrs. Elmo Disney) of Pickering, Muriel (Mrs. Lawson Parks) of Oshawa, Harold, Gerald and Ronald all of Toronto.

There are also 15 grandchildren and 15 great grandchildren.

Mrs. Clarke is 84 years old and her husband 82. He worked as a crane operator for many years and was a stationary engineer during World War II.

Mrs. Clarke has been active in the United

Church Women's group in Greenwood and Mr. Clarke has served on various boards of Greenwood United Church.

She told The Tribune that the 60 years have gone by quickly and have been "wonderful years".

"I expect the next 60 years will go quicker

yet", she said with a laugh.

The grandchildren presented their grandma and grandpa with 60 red roses and the sons and daughters gave an air conditioner. The community gave the couple a purse of money to commemorate the anniversary.



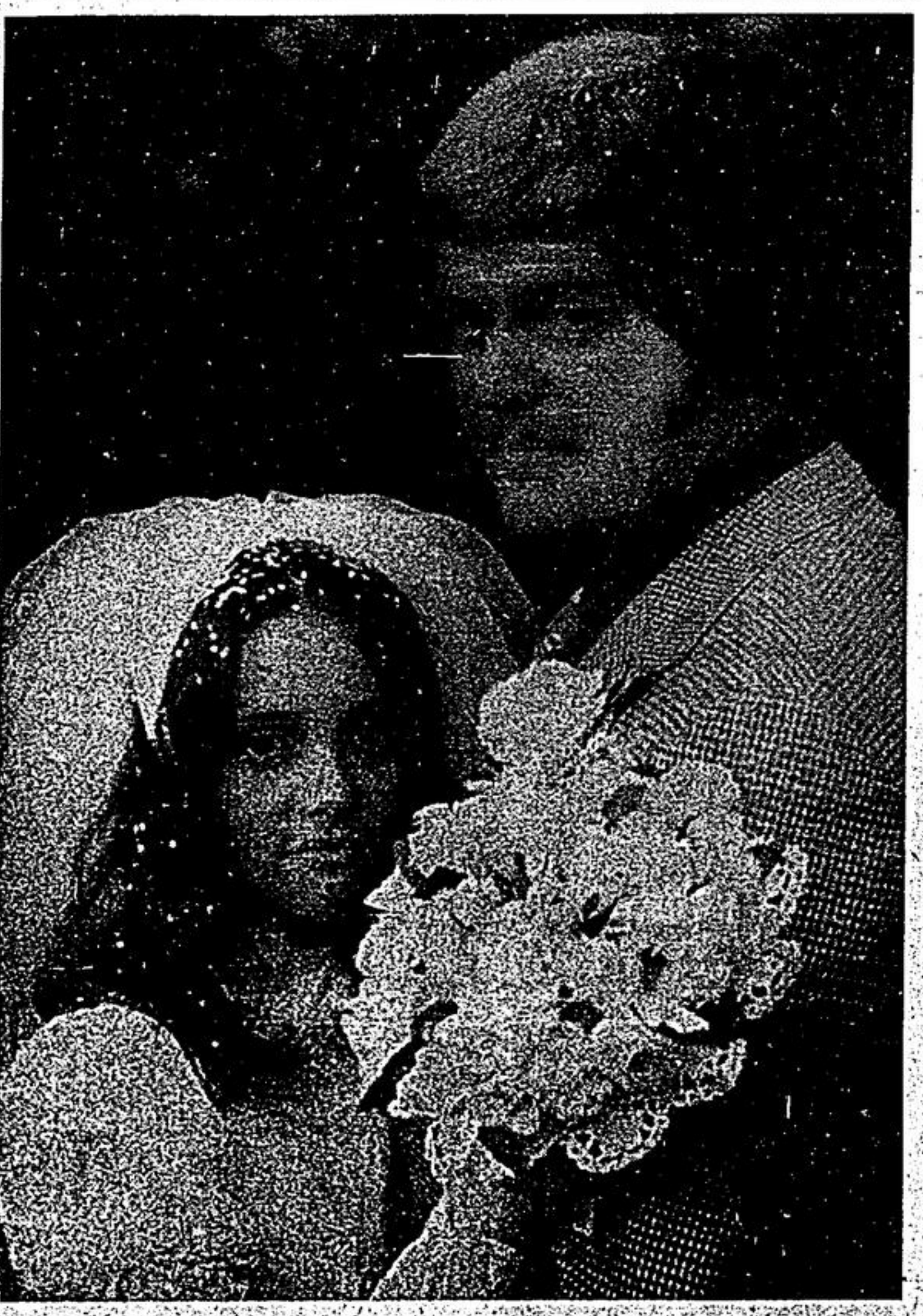

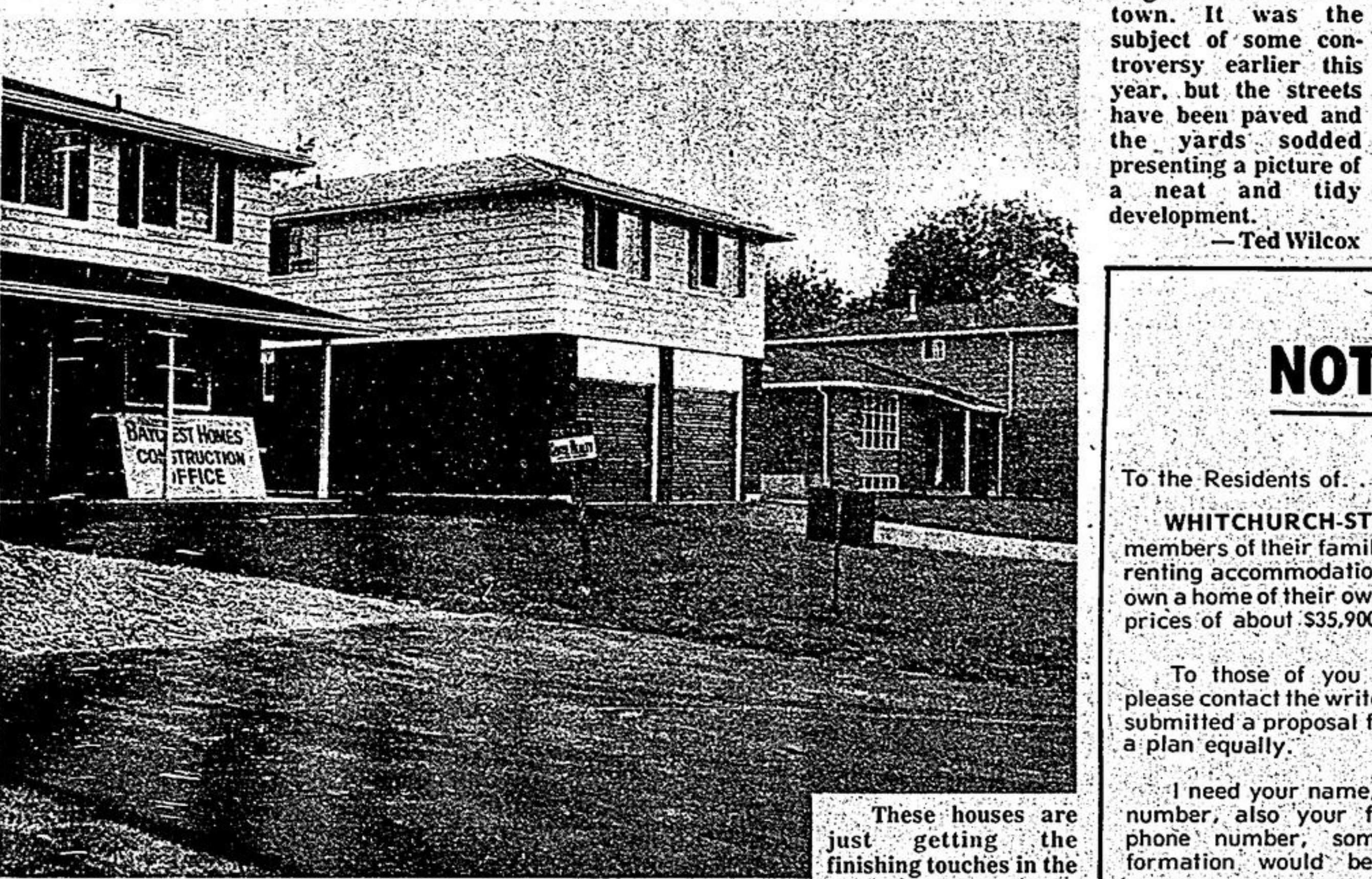
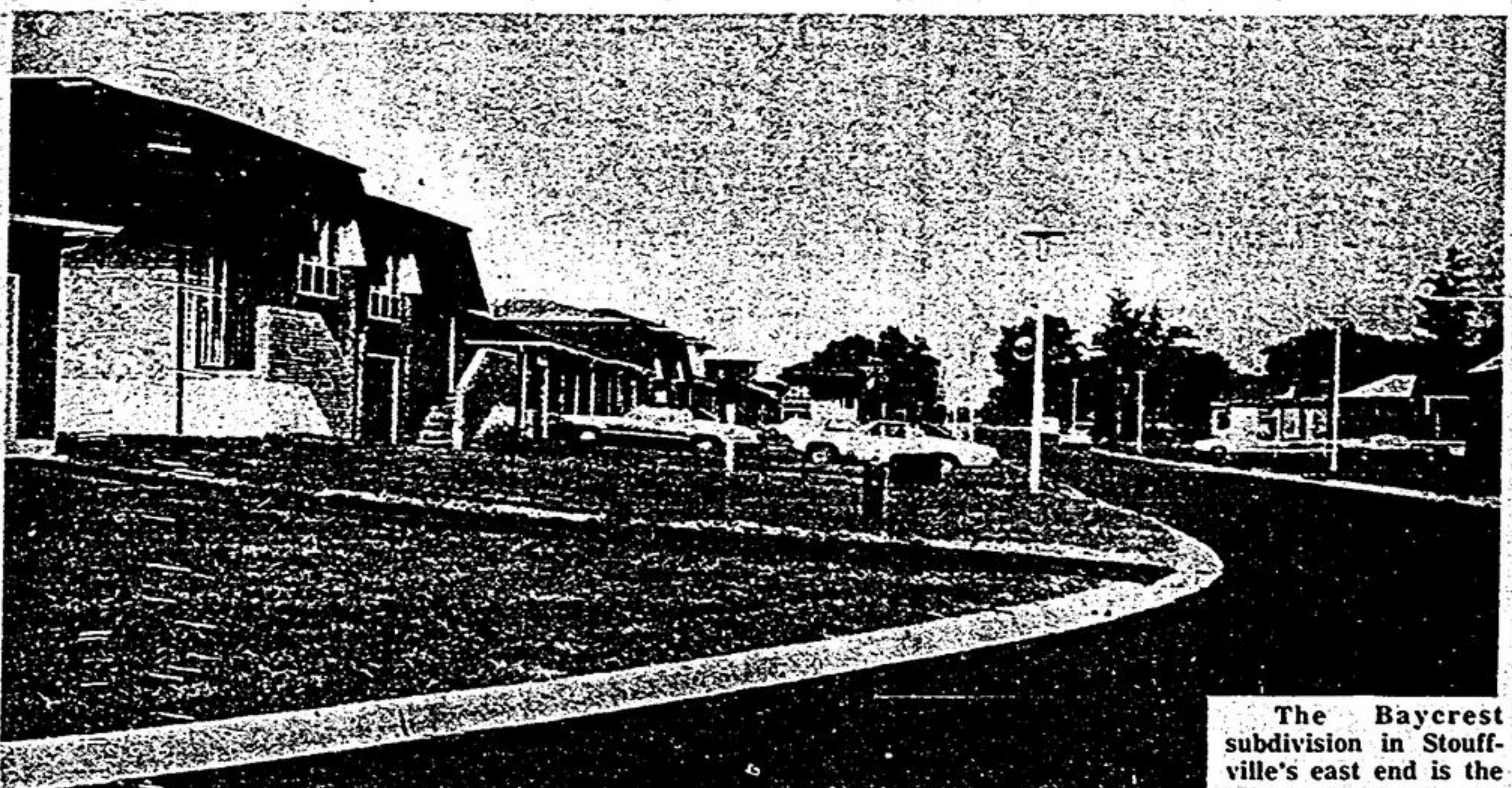

## Uxbridge approves 8 grants

**UXBRIDGE** — A grant of \$1,125 to the Scott Agricultural Society was among several passed by Uxbridge Council last week.

Only one drew comment. A \$25 grant to the Markham Fair was questioned. Finance Committee Chairman Maustyn McKnight explained that many people in the southern part of the township take part in that fair.

"The president of the fair this year lives in Uxbridge" he said.

Other grants were — North Ontario Plowmen, \$225; Ontario County Crop Improvement Assoc., \$50; Uxbridge Horticultural Society, \$50; Farm Safety Council, \$50; Uxbridge Legion Pipe Band, \$250; and Uxbridge Red Cross Society, \$50.

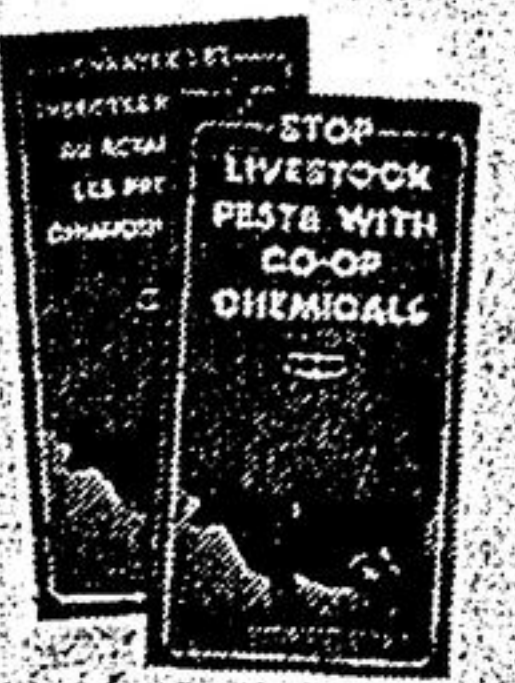
