**Amusing, functional**  
**Psychedelic design for library**

**STOUFFVILLE** — When passing the new location for the Whitchurch Stouffville Public Library, pedestrians have been staring, smiling, wincing, and even stopping. The interest is generated by a colorful, psychedelic design being painted on the front windows by Ken E. Jobe of Ballantrae.

Mr. Jobe, former art director for Chatelaine magazine, says, "I love the reaction of the kids. It's worth a million dollars just to be here."

The purpose of the design will serve, Mr. Jobe believes, is "to amuse people, to brighten up a rather dull corner."

Also, he said, it will be the kind of thing children around the library "can fantasize with."

Indeed, Mr. Jobe's most fascinated fans on the sidewalk did appear to be the under-12 set.

The design will be functional as well, Mr. Jobe added. It will serve as a kind of protection from the outside so that the library won't be a sort of fishbowl. And, it will keep too much sunlight from coming in, he said.

Mr. Jobe offered his services to the library when he read the appeal for volunteers in a front-page story in The Tribune. "I figure if people don't help out on things like this, what happens to your town, what happens to your community?" he said.

Mr. Jobe is being assisted on the window mural by two local artists: Gay Gibson of Rose St., and John Roberts, who teaches art at Stouffville Dist. Secondary School.

As a member of the Art Director's Club in Toronto and former chairman of their show committee, along with being an award-winner for his design and art
