Art Grove bowls top

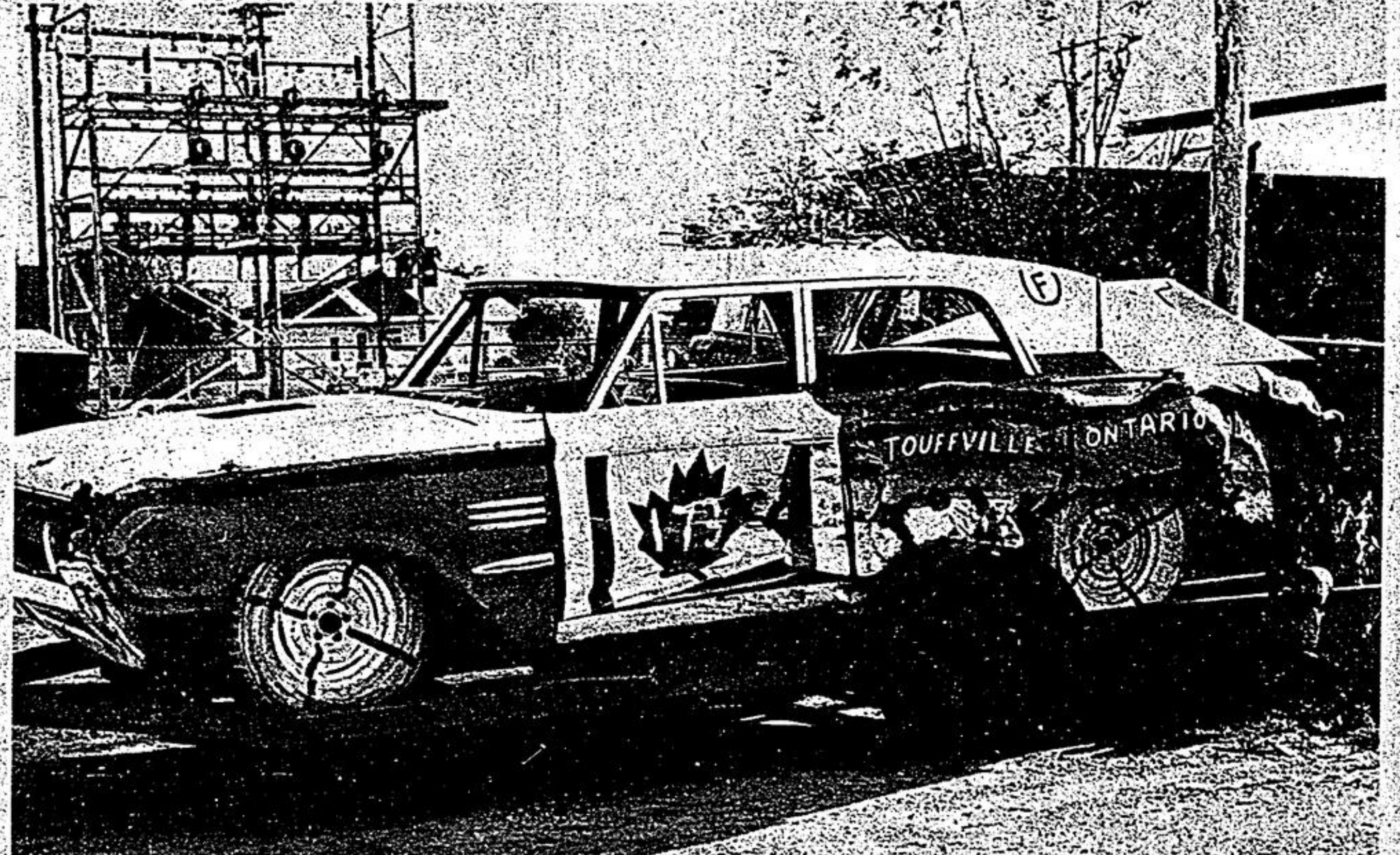
STOUFFVILLE — Art Grove bowled a sparkling 830 for the best triple score in Monday
