present the antiquated conditions at Summitview School. The \$75,000.00 allocated for renovations in October 1973 has not been spent for this purpose but has been removed from the 1974 budget.

It seems that the proposed library and all-purpose room will never become a reality, as the condition for additional facilities rests on the recommendation of "experts" from the Ministry of Education. The ministry may find that further improvements are not practical. This means that the old school will be demolished and accommodation provided at a new Elementary School to be located on a site where future development is planned.

At best, any new facilities will not be available until 1976 and it is more probable that the students will have to wait for a new school.
