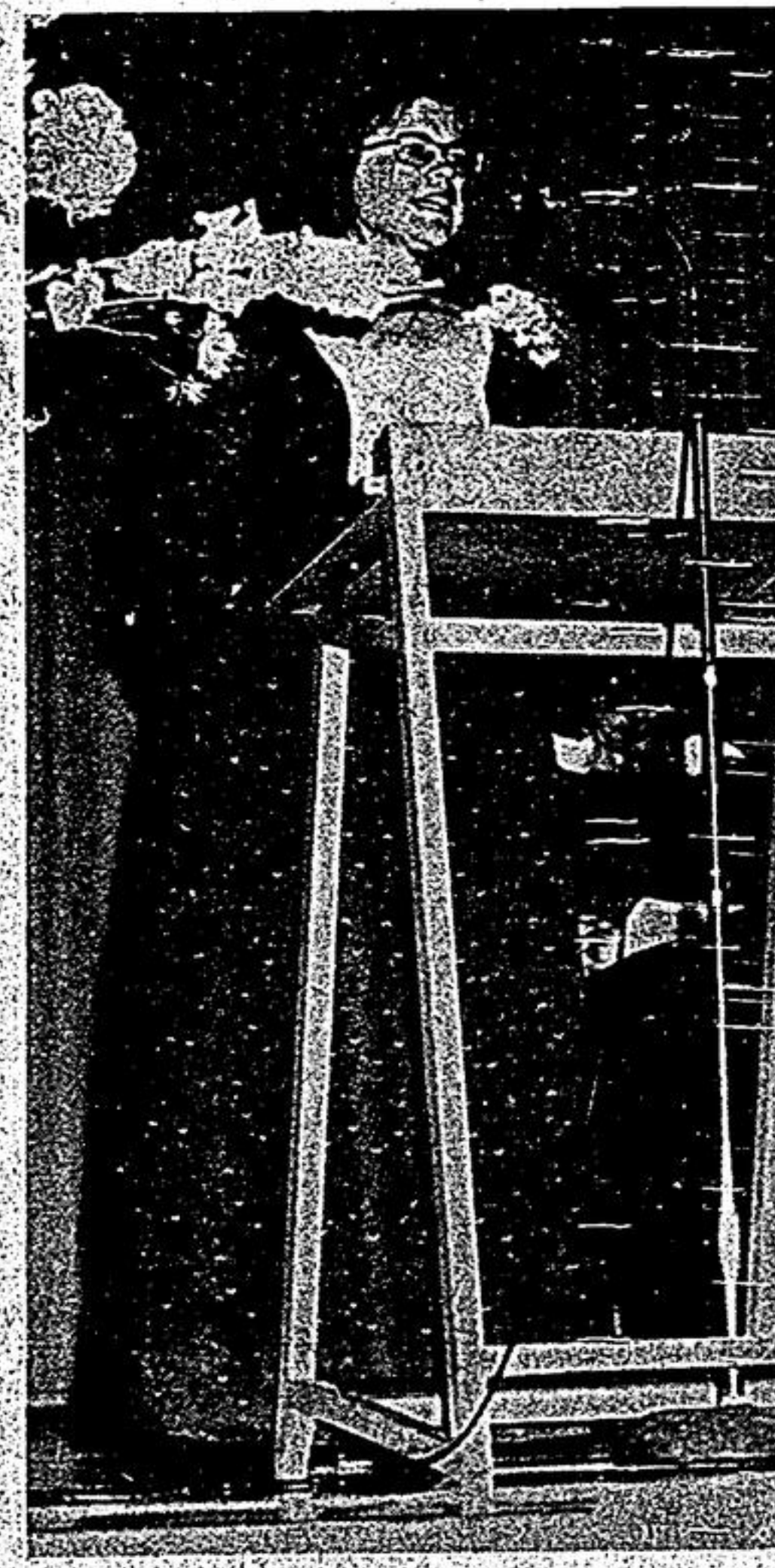

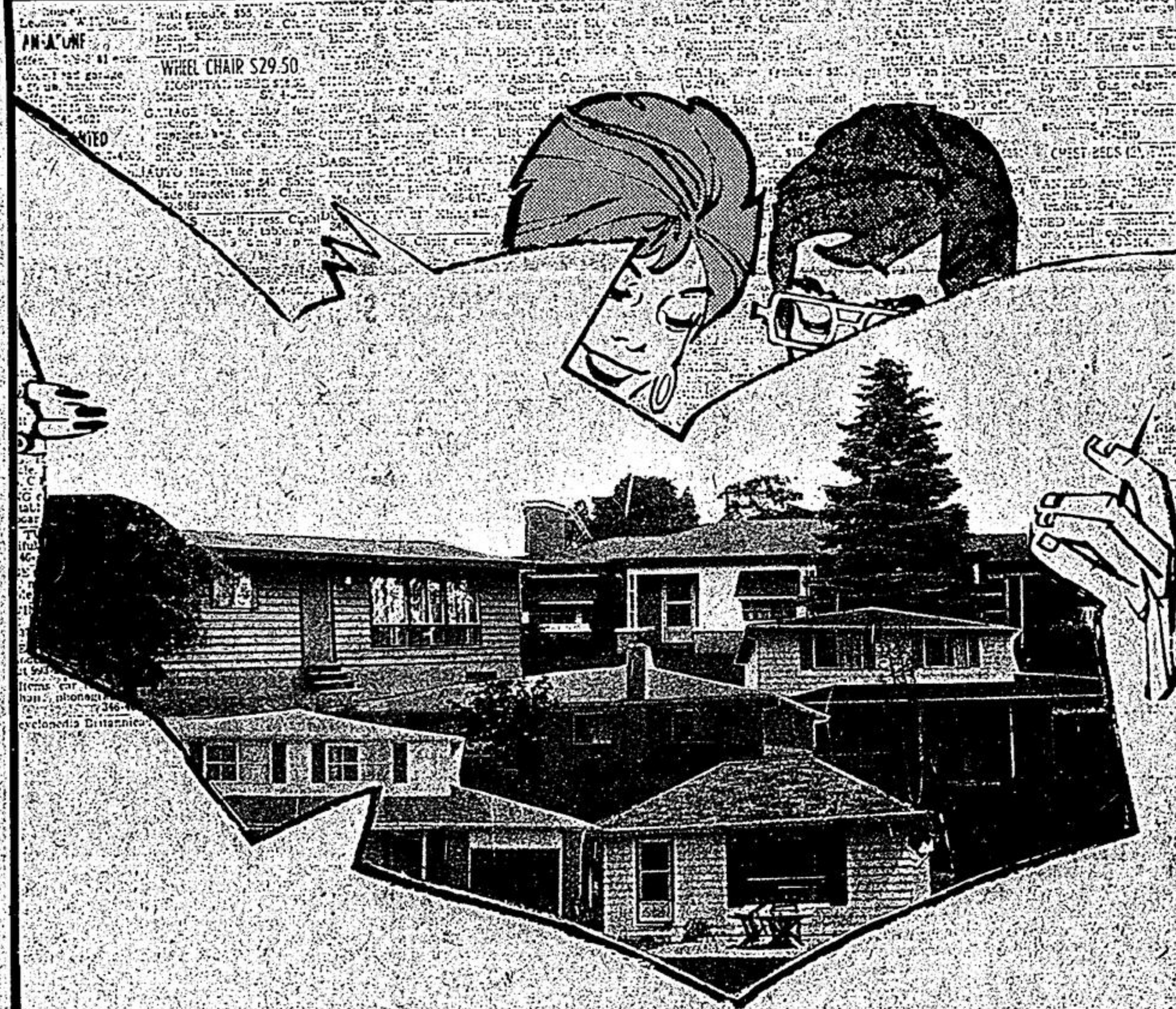

Brawl erupts as meeting ends

STOUFFVILLE - In the closing minutes of the last Planning Board meeting, an unexpected verbal brawl erupted which, at times, threatened to degenerate into a mud-slinging match.
 The dispute arose when councillor Eldred King, seconded by councillor Art Starr, introduced a resolution concerning the proposed Harding Gate plaza development on the east side of town. The motion would have had the effect of tying the plaza development to the residential development in Concession 9, and would have delayed a rezoning application until both projects had reached the same stage.
 Although not listed on the agenda, solicitor F.P. Stein rose and asked if he might address the Board on behalf of his client, Harding Gate Developments Ltd. Board members agreed to hear his submission.
 "My client only heard of this resolution today," Stein said. "There was no notice at all that this matter would be coming up."
 The solicitor referred to an earlier resolution passed by council on Sept. 24, which he had interpreted as approval for the first phase of the plaza development.
 "On the basis of that, my client made plans and spent a considerable sum of money," he said. "This resolution before you tonight has come as a complete shock... my client wants to cooperate, but we feel this resolution could delay us for who knows how many weeks, months, years. This is very unfair. It has put my client into a very bad position financially."
 "We feel that in any debate on this matter, my client should have notice of it and be allowed to be represented," Chairman Marilyn Baker, appearing taken aback by the vehemence of Mr. Stein's protest, observed that the land has not yet been rezoned.
 "I have no idea why he would go to such expense before the rezoning is done," said the chairman. "I think it's council's privilege to have some word in how this development shall be phased."
 Mr. Stein assured the Board that he was not suggesting otherwise, but maintained that the earlier resolution had demonstrated a clear intention on the part of council that the development should proceed.
 "This was discussed at some length," Baker replied. "There was no iron-clad guarantee or promise given... this was just talk."
 Councillor Eldred King indicated that he was not entirely satisfied with the developer's statements so far, and called for "specifics" to be presented.
 "We need specifics about tenancy," he said. "Who you are going to get in there, how the plaza will be filled. We're involved with some commercial development in the downtown area right now, we're trying to establish the fact that the downtown core is firmly established and people will come there to shop."
