## God's love is plentiful

Gather up the fragments that remain, that nothing be lost. — John 6:12  
This Sunday is the last in the ecclesiastical year. From ancient times it has been celebrated as a kind of eve of Advent anticipating the lesson of Advent.

Jeremiah prophesied in the midst of ruin and sorrow, "future deliverance and greatness in the Kingdom of the Messiah who is called the Lord Our Righteousness, the branch of the stem of Jesse. (Jer 23: 5-8 and Jer 33:14-16)

In England it became known as "Stir Up Sunday." Coming as it does only a month before Christmas, it is a reminder that the time has come to "stir up" the Christmas pudding and the Christmas cake.

St. Andrew recognized Jesus to be the Christ. He was the first to tell someone of Him. He found his own brother Simon, afterwards known as Simon Peter. He said to him: "We have found the Messiah." Jesus found Philip, and immediately Philip told his friend Nathanael, exclaiming: "We have found Him of whom Moses in the law and the prophets did write, Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph. (John 1:35-45)

But of course that is not all. The special collect for the day, a very ancient one, begins with this petition: "Stir up, we beseech thee O Lord, the will of thy faithful people. This is followed by the reason for the request, "that they (God's faithful people) plenteously bring forth the fruit of good works, may of thee be plenteously rewarded."

The stage is set for the final act. The second Advent promise will be fulfilled. Jesus is coming. "Stir up we beseech thee, O Lord, the wills of thy faithful people; that they, plenteously bringing forth the fruit of good works, may of thee be plenteously rewarded; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen."

God's greatest reward for energetic service to Him is love, because He is love. He supplies it "plenteously" both our free love to Him and to each other, and His free gift to us.

Praise be to the Christ. Thanks be to God.
