**Street name draws humorous response**

**STOUFFVILLE** — Council members were less than thrilled by the name, Mostar Cres. proposed for the new industrial road near Cable Tech.

The new roadway, presently under construction, is entirely paid for by Cable Tech, McNeil Laboratories and the owners of the Fenson property.

The letter from Cable Tech said, "In view of the time and effort spent by our company to reach agreement of all parties to create this road and dedicate it to the town we would like the privilege of naming this road."

"It sounds like it came from a computer," was Councillor Art Starr's immediate reaction.

Councillor June Button commented, "I don't like the name."

Mr. Starr then suggested Button Drive and Mrs. Button countered with Ratcliff Boulevard.

Councillor Eldred King was curious as to how they arrived at that name and added, "I wonder if the street will be a crescent."

The matter was referred to by-laws committee and a report will be forthcoming.

According to the letter, "The name does not now exist in Metropolitan Toronto or surrounding areas and it is our belief that it will be accepted for registration."

Siegfried Riemer, President of Cable Tech, has been unavailable for comment for the past week. It is not yet known where the name Mostar originated.
