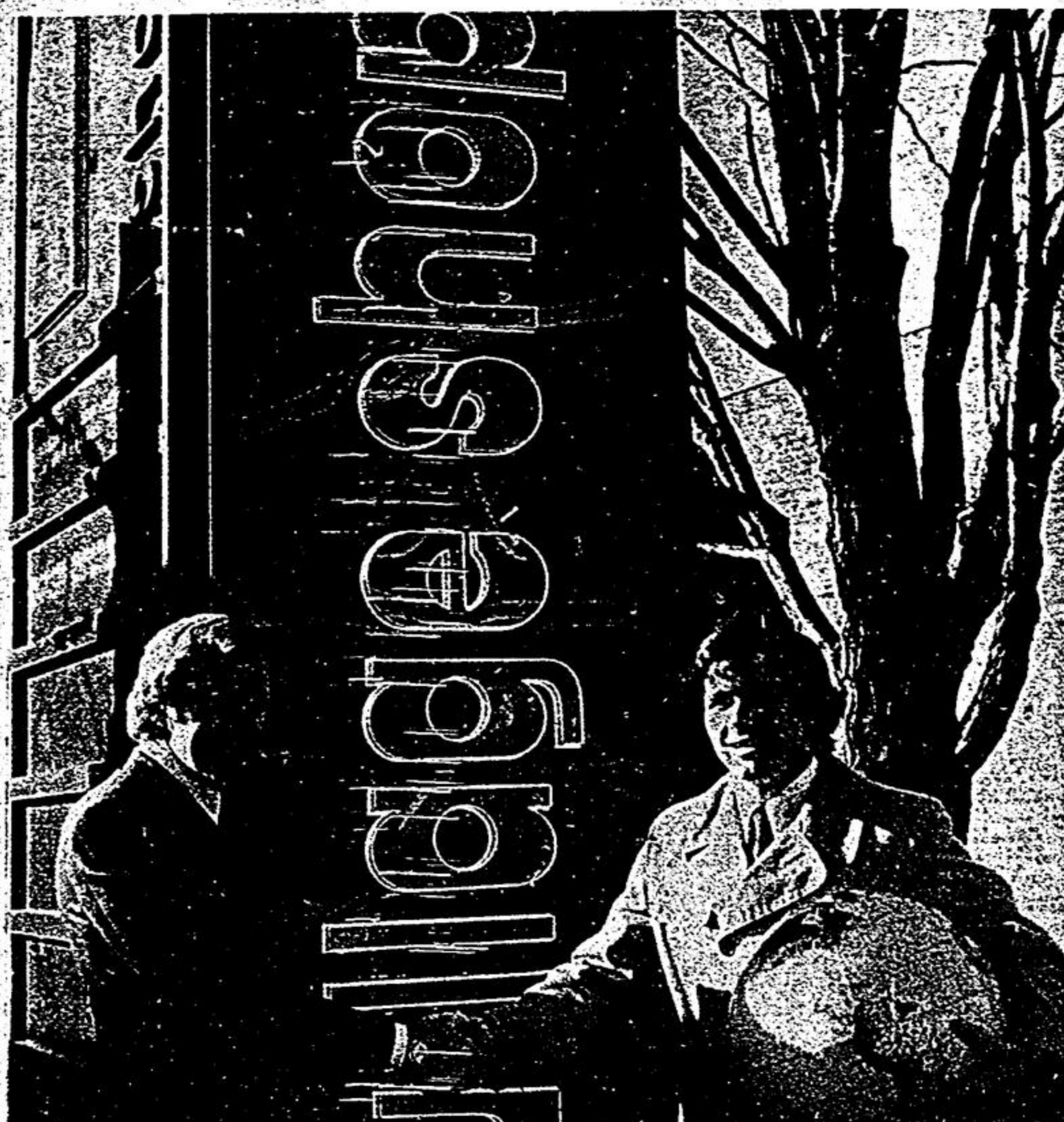
Keith Liedke moved to Stouffville with his family 11 years ago and attended Orchard Park Public School and later Stouffville Dist. Secondary School.

"We indicated they should go ahead and hire a man and include the cost in the centre budget," he said. According to the mayor some people have gotten the impression council is against the rink but he says this is "a misunderstanding."

"We are in full support of the centre boards' outdoor ice skating rinks," he concluded.

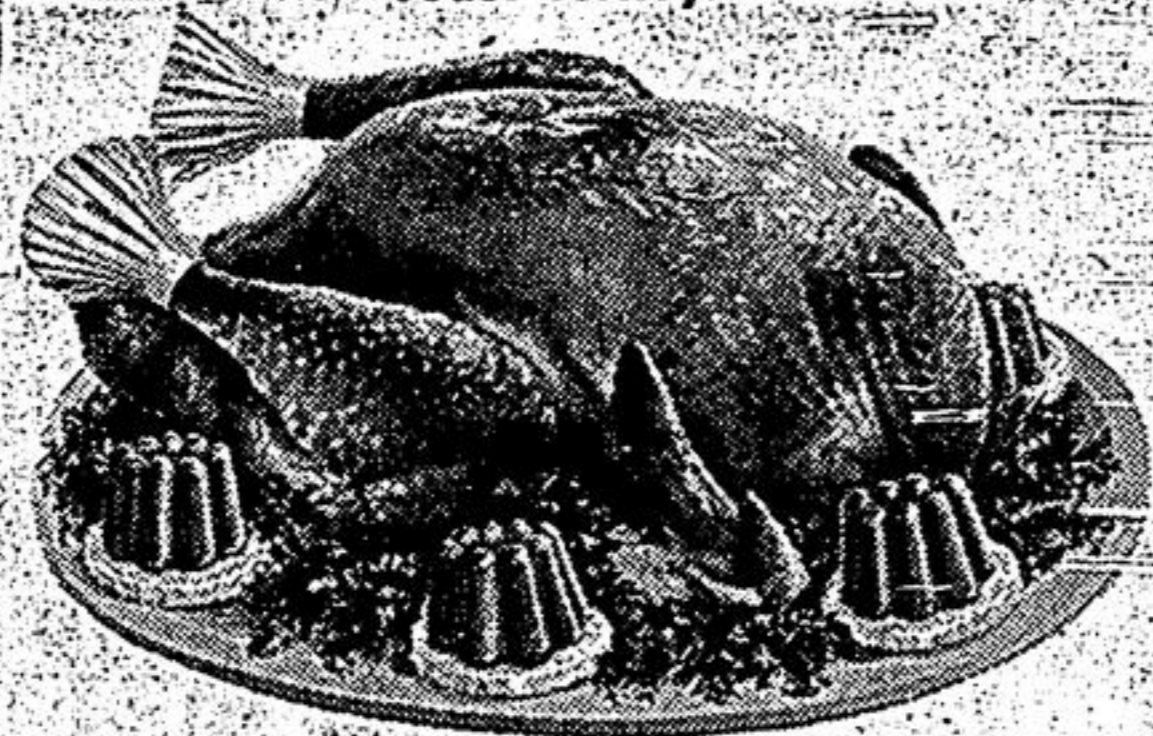

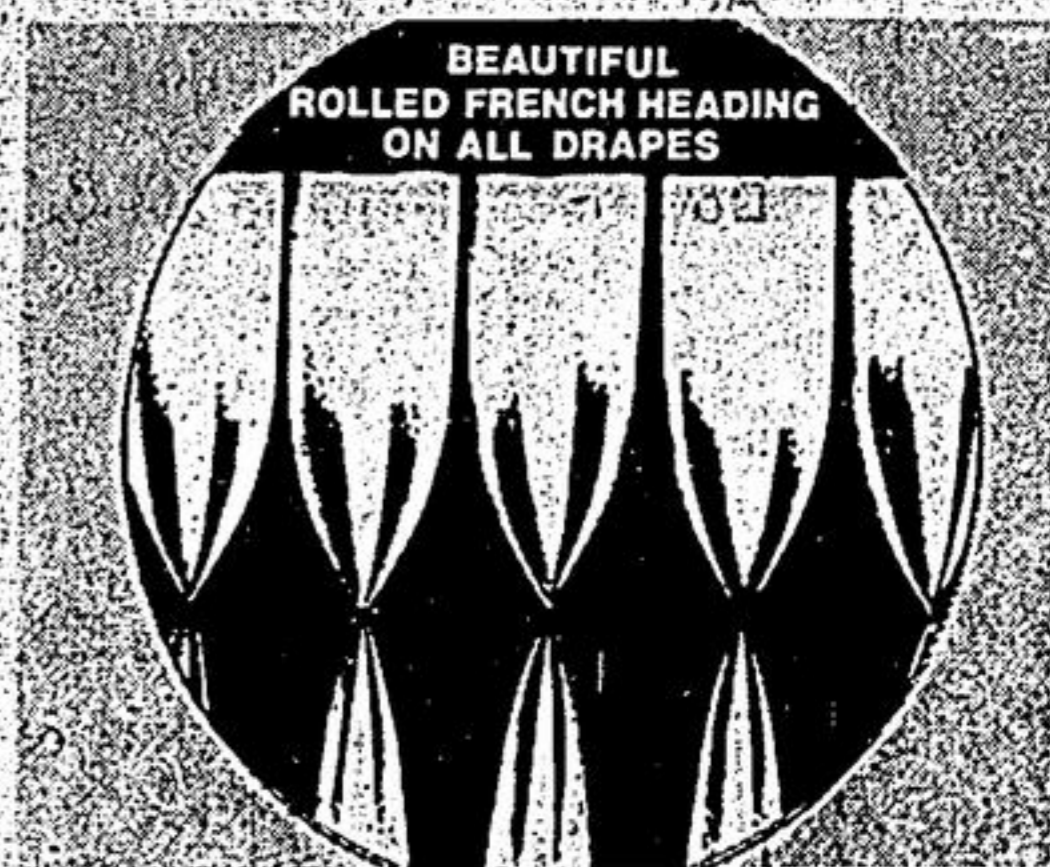
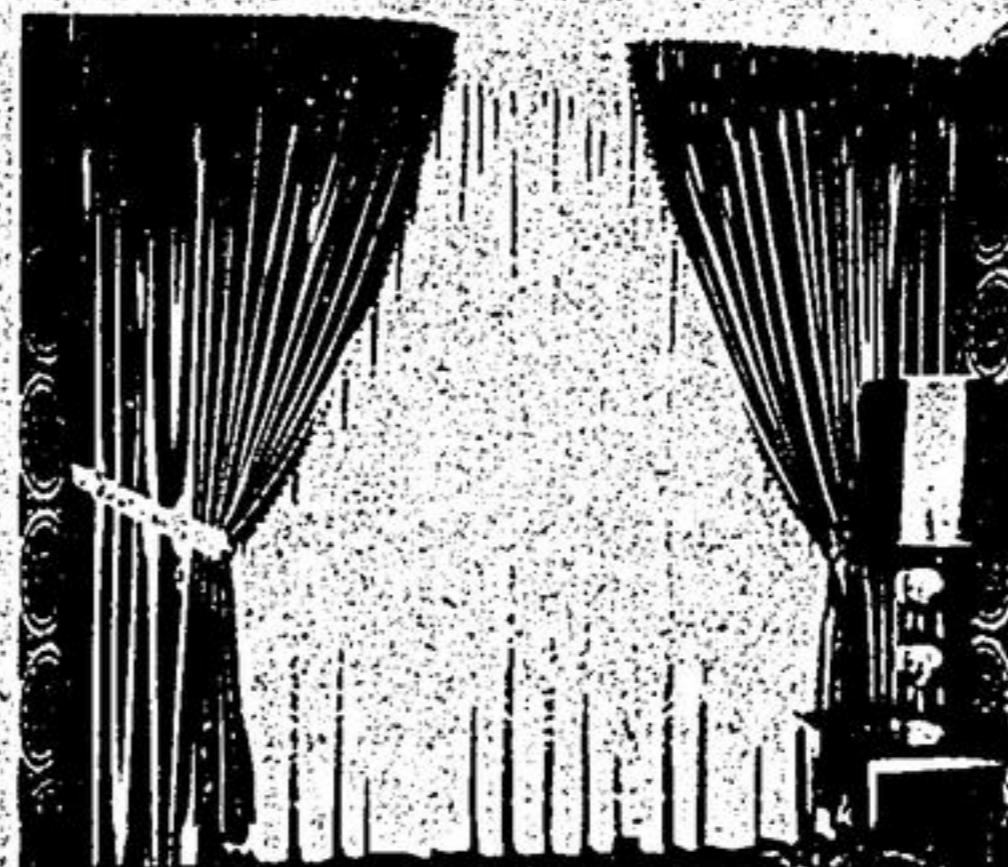
